The ABQ Journey: Pre-KG to Grade 12





The talents and uniqueness of our students are represented by the colourful wings of the ABQ butterfly.










How we teach

ABQ Explorer focuses on a process of learning, rather than relying solely on learning outcomes to drive children's development. Our IEYC process of learning successfully captures children's natural curiosity as a starting point and balances child-initiated and teacher-enhanced learning within an encouraging environment.

It is never too early to begin exploring the world.





The **entry point** is an activity that begins each unit of work. It is usually a fun, engaging start to the theme. It gets the children excited about what they will learn in a specific unit.

Capturing Curiosity allows children to reveal what they would like to learn about the theme. Their feedback will be used to plan for future learning.

Enabling the Environment is the creating of indoor and outdoor spaces to support different types of

The Big Picture provides children with some context to a specific IEYC unit of learning so that connections can be made between previous and new learning.

The **Explore & Express** parts of the learning process provide lots of opportunities and experiences where children play and learn together.

The Exit Point is where children share, reflect, and celebrate what they have learnt.







At ABQ Explorer, we believe that:

Each child is unique and has individual needs.

Children develop through similar stages but at different rates and in different ways.

Young children come to kindergarten from diverse backgrounds and with varied experiences.

Young children are naturally curious and eager to learn. Their learning is enhanced by interactions with others, including children and adults, as well as the environment.

Young children learn through play. Through play, children explore and experiment with their environment to add to their knowledge, learn new skills and practice familiar ones. Current brain research confirms that opportunities for children to learn through play help the development of the brain.

Parents are their child's first and most important teachers. Parents and teachers work as partners to support learning both at home and at school.






School hours
