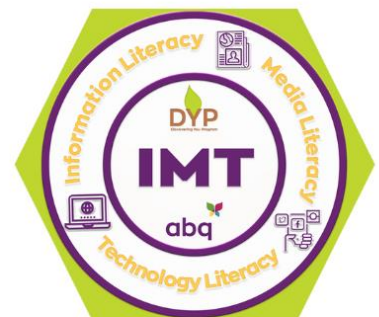

INFORMATION LITERACY ACTIVITY:

Identify source credibility: Evaluate the reliability of each source. Is the information coming from an official industry page or a blog? What makes one source more trustworthy than another?

Create a career profile: Summarise your findings into a career profile, highlighting key information like required education, average salary, job outlook, and your personal insights. Explain how you verified that the information you gathered was accurate and trustworthy.
