



ARX seizes the moment. Also this historic project is a catalyst for future ventures that break through impenetrable rock, cross national borders, and race into the world beyond.






Ceneri Base Tunnel

With a length of 15.4 km, the Ceneri Base Tunnel is the southernmost part of the larger Alp-Transit project, which is part of the European Rhine-alpine corridor. Thanks in part to its completion, northern and southern Europe are now closer together. Designed for a speed of 250 km/h, the project consists of two single-track tunnels connected by cross-passages every 325 m. The tunnel is mainly in rock with a maximum overburden of 800 m. Excavation is by drill and blast, TBM and mechanically assisted tunnelling in soft ground. After support measures with rock bolts, shotcrete and steel arches, the waterproofing and drainage system is installed and the final concrete lining is put in place. Interior finishes, cable network, concrete slab track, rigid catenary, ventilation and electrical equipment complete the infrastructure.



When speed takes time

Shortening the Lugano-Locarno railway line by 21 minutes took almost thirty years, giving southern Swiss residents a new perspective on time and space. Previously distant places are now closer, there are more choices of where to live and work, and greater opportunities have become available. The Ceneri Base Tunnel is a regional, national, and European structure that runs along a main European railway corridor.

Drilling through a mountain is never an easy task. Drilling through the Alps even less so. But with respect for the mountains as motivation, ARX pushed forward to reduce heavy road transport and energy consumption, making roads safer and bringing people and cultures together. Facing the challenge of excavating up to ten meters under a motorway, they gathered their best experts and harnessed the team's creative abilities. 






N2 – Refurbishment Melide-Grancia Tunnel


Maxi-hydroelectric power station in the heart of the Alps

The Limmern PSPP (1'000 MW) is a new underground hydroelectric power plant integrated into the existing power plants of Linth-Limmern hydroelectric complex, boosting the overall installed capacity from 480 MW to 1'480 MW. The plant is using the enlarged Lake Mutt (2'474 m a.s.l.) as an upper reservoir and the existing Lake of Limmernboden (1'854 m a.s.l.) as a lower reservoir. The underground power station consists of a power-house cavern with the 4 machine groups of 250 MW each (in pumping and turbine mode). It also includes a transformer cavern with the 4 transformers of approximately 200 tons each that convert the voltage of the generators from 18 kV to 400 kV. The energy produced feeds into the Swiss extra-high voltage grid.





Other underground works for the project: a headrace pressure tunnel with prestressed concrete lining; a surge shaft with reinforced concrete lining; 2 headrace pressure tunnels (2 x 1'030 m, D 5.20 m and 40° inclination ca. 84%); 2 tailrace pressure tunnels (2 x 500 m, D 5.50 m) with prestressed concrete lining; and several access tunnels and caverns including a smoke extraction shaft (L 252 m, D 4.20 m, inclination 98%).

New Railway line Brescia-Verona

The new HS/HC Brescia East-Verona railway line is one of the linchpins of the Core Mediterranean Corridor set to connect the ports of the south of the Iberian Peninsula with the Ukrainian border. The alignment runs for approximately 48 km. The project includes the construction of three railway tunnels for a total length of almost 13 km. The tunnels are in a highly heterogeneous soft ground, for this reason the construction is performed by means of mechanized tunneling (EPB machine) and conventional method and as well as the execution of several sections by means of cut and cover and top-down. The main challenges of the project are represented by the excavation at very low overburden in soft ground underneath existing highways and buildings. Once completed, this significant railway project will allow for a swift connection between the cities of Brescia and Verona, becoming part of a broader expansion of the Italian high-speed rail network.



TELT Tunnel Euralpin Lyon-Turin

The Tunnel Euralpin Lyon-Turin (TELT), part of the TEN-T transport network, has a main element of the cross-border section linking France and Italy via a 57.5 km high speed railway tunnel. The tunnel crosses various alpine geological units with very heterogeneous conditions and high overburden till 2'000 m, which posed particular technical and design challenges. The tunnel comprises two twin single-track tunnels which are connected by cross-passages every 333 metres. The system is completed by 3 underground emergency and 4 access tunnels. The total excavation length is approximately 160 km. For 75% of the total length, the base tunnel is excavated using different types of TBM, depending on the expected geological risks: Gripper TBMs; Shielded TBMs; Dual Mode TBMs. Other aspects requiring in-depth design studies include logistics and the reutilization of excavated material. The work has been divided into 12 main packages. ARX is playing a major role, participating in the main construction lots both in France and Italy: Lot CO8 - Underground works from the Saint-Julien-Montdenis portal; Lot CO6/7 - Underground works between Saint-Martin-la-Porte and Modane; Lot CO5a - Avrieux ventilation shafts and underground caverns; Lot CO 3/4 – Main Underground work in Italy, Lot CO2 – Civil works in Susa; Lot CO1 - Underground works for the connection of the existing line.

Bringing France and Italy closer together; bringing Europe closer together

Base tunnels aim to level out gradients in order to speed up rail traffic. The TELT base tunnel will accomplish this, reducing travel time from 80 to 25 minutes, while using significantly less energy. Once it is operating, far-reaching environmental benefits will result. Additionally, intermodal transport will increase economic opportunities throughout Europe.

The tunnel will be excavated at an altitude of 250 m above sea level and a depth of 1.7 kilometers. The excavated material will then be processed into concrete. Requiring the highest level of technical expertise, the TELT base tunnel also relies on ARX's gravitas to navigate geopolitical and administrative complexities. Two nations; two ideologies; two sets of laws; one goal.









The TELT base tunnel is one of the world's longest base tunnels, and the fifth of my career

This one is special in that it passes through the Alps, through little-known valleys, linking two major cities: Lyon and Turin. It strengthens the relationship between France and Italy, bringing neighbors together.

CERN High Luminosity Large Hadron Collider (HL-LHC), Point 5

The Large Hadron Collider (LHC) at CERN, located on the French-Swiss border near Geneva, is the largest scientific instrument ever designed and built for fundamental research. The High-Luminosity Large Hadron Collider (HL-LHC) is an upgrade of the presently operating LHC, aiding scientific progress by increasing its current performance ten-fold to further enhance its discovery potential. In order to accommodate the new technical infrastructure at the LHC's Point 5 (which houses CMS, one of the two main detectors), it was necessary to construct new surface and underground structures, including a vertical shaft 80 m deep with an excavation diameter of 12 m, a service cavern 50 m long with an excavation area of 270 m², 600 m of galleries connected to the LHC tunnel, and 14 vertical connecting cores. The first part of the vertical shaft was excavated in loose material using excavation buckets; the remainder was excavated in rock by mechanical means using a roadheader and rock breaker The new surface structures consist of a number of technical buildings on the Point 5 site, constructed of mixed steel and concrete with a pre-cast facade.


From the origins of the universe to cancer research


From day one, the upgrade of CERN's flagship particle accelerator captivated those who worked on it. They felt the significance of this pioneering research centre where engineers and scientists collaborated. CERN's scientific campus and its accelerator complex are home to a range of discoveries, including the invention of the World Wide Web, the operation of a unique antimatter facility, and the experimental discovery of the Higgs boson —a scalar particle with zero spin that gives mass to all other fundamental particles.

Excavation of the new underground areas for the HL-LHC upgrade was done in molasse. The proximity to the existing LHC infrastructure called for leading technical solutions, such as a BIM interface. This enabled the generation and management of intelligent data used throughout the project's life cycle.

For me, CERN has always been a mysterious place, where large scientific experiments are carried out. Now, I can say that I've played my small part in developing particle physics research in Europe.

The main objective of CERN's HL-LHC project is to fully exploit the potential of the LHC infrastructure, to study the Higgs particle, and to test the Standard Model of physics to the highest accessible accuracy.

Grand Paris Express – Lot 15 Sud Lot T3C

This 8.2 km section of the Grand Paris Express joins the Fort d'Issy-Vanves-Clamart to the future Villejuif-Louis Aragon station, incorporating 5 new stations and 8 ancillary structures. Key features include the Arcueil-Cachan station, which connects to line 15 south and RER line B, and the Chatillon-Montrouge station, part of the T3C section. Villejuif Gustave-Roussy station is a major hub for lines 14 South and 15 South, situated 48 meters underground. Additionally, the OA-P04 - Park Robespierre in Bagneux features a bi-lobed molded-wall enclosure, excavated to a depth of 36.7 meters.

This spectacular suspension bridge brings life on the island of Sotra closer to the city of Bergen. Located in the Norwegian county of Vestland, the Sotra Link project is a sophisticated system of bridges, tunnels, cycling paths, pedestrian underpasses, and connections to secondary roads. It implements a "macro-micro" approach to ensure sustainable mobility and unite local, regional, and national interests.

It's scheduled to open in June 2027. Once operational, it will reduce travel time by 20 minutes, eliminating traffic bottlenecks and improving access to the island of Sotra.













Joint Water Pollution Control Plant (JWPCP) Effluent Outfall Tunnel


A Tunnel for the City of Angels

Much of the sewage produced by inhabitants of Los Angeles ends up at the Joint Water Pollution Control Plant (JWPCP) in Carson. From there, the treated water reaches the ocean through two tunnels that have been in operation for more than 60 years but are no longer meeting demand. This new 7-mile tunnel will ensure continued protection of the environment and public health.

The work ranges from 30 to 450 feet below ground, following the route of existing roads. This solution was chosen for its two distinct advantages. Firstly, working several meters underground reduces disruption to surface activities as it affects road traffic only marginally. Secondly, tunneling below streets utilizes the public right of way, minimizing authorization and bureaucratic involvement. It is expected to be completed in 2027, when the tunnel will join the existing ocean drains at Royal Palms Beach in San Pedro, California.













The new Los Angeles, California JWPCP effluent outfall tunnel is designed to provide relief and redundancy to the existing tunnels built almost a century ago

From the Andes to the ocean waves

The economy of a region, in the era of globalization, depends on its efficiency in receiving the products it needs and exporting those it makes. This is why port facilities play a strategic role, especially if one lives in a country that is largely bordered by territories with little infrastructure, such as the Andes and the Amazon, and instead has the Pacific as its gateway to the world. The modernization of the port of Paita, the second largest in Peru in terms of container movement, has made the economy of the entire region more dynamic.

The modernization works, including the new container pier, were inaugurated in October 2014, and made it possible to triple the terminal's performance, reaching up to 70 containers per hour/ship. As a result, Paita has become one of the top 50 ports in the American sub-continent.









Ports are gateways that facilitate the exchange of goods between nations and play a vital role in the global economy

The second port in Peru in terms of container movement, Paita mobilizes import and export containers and general cargo.

The challenge of designing all 3 extension phases was addressed by a simple honesty which goes straight to the essence of the physical characteristics of the materials under consideration of acting forces such as gravity, temperature, earthquake, mooring and berthing loads.



The silver river shines again

In South America, the Rio de la Plata (the Silver River) is the great estuary flowing between Buenos Aires and Montevideo. Some of its tributaries, such as the Riachuelo, are considered among the most polluted basins on earth, with millions living on its banks of unfiltered industrial sewage.

Driven to put an end to this desperate situation, the local community has collaborated with the World Bank in this extensive restoration. The project is divided into several lots, 3 of which are interdependent and interconnected, presenting distinct engineering challenges. Lot 1, the 'Riachuelo Left Margin Collector', intercepts both industrial and civil wastewater, preventing it from entering the river. Lot 2, the 'Plant for Water Pretreatment', deals with the physical treatment of wastewater. And Lot 3, 'Outfall', receives the pre-treated water and discharges it by diffusion into the Río de la Plata 12 km from the coast.







Energy from the ground for a sustainable future

The weakness of renewable energy is its dependence on uncontrollable factors: the presence of the sun for photovoltaics, and rainfall that fills reservoirs for hydroelectricity. In Australia, Snowy 2.0 is a cyclopean project, extending for tens of kilometers underground, based on a closed-loop hydroelectric production system. Using excess photovoltaic and wind energy to replenish the water used in storage reservoirs, there is always water available for energy production.

The project, owned by Snowy Hydro, connects two existing reservoirs belonging to the Snowy Mountain Scheme—Tantangara and Talbingo—through 27 km of tunnels and the construction of a new underground power station at a depth of about 800 metres. Snowy 2.0 is considered a vital project for Australia's economy and energy transmission. Its aim is to provide massive water storage for the hydroelectric generation needed to balance the growth of wind and solar energy. This will result in the retirement of thermal power stations.









Snowy 2.0 is a cornerstone project allowing Australia to progress toward a renewable future, poised to realize the government's ambitious net zero target by 2050

Its complexity is unparalleled, encompassing challenges in geology, scale, transient pressures, design longevity, and the intricate load cycles throughout its operational lifespan. Engaging with such a multifaceted endeavor has been amongst the highlights of my technical career journey, offering a profound opportunity for all involved to appreciate the marvels of modern engineering.

Moreover, it serves as a rich repository of lessons learned, invaluable for guiding the development of future plants in the country.

Forrestfield-Airport Link, WA

The Forrestfield-Airport Link is a train line that connects the outer Perth suburb of Forrestfield to the city. 






Asia


Friendship travels over the waves of the sea

Macau consists of a single peninsula and two islands. One of these, the island of Taipa, is connected to the peninsula by several bridges. At 3 km, the longest and most impressive of these is the 'Ponte da Amizade' (Friendship Bridge), which is crossed by the millions of visitors every year who land at the international airport and travel to Taipa. In Macau, Asian exotic charm meets Portuguese colonial architecture. The result is futuristic buildings such as the Macau Tower, more than 300 meters high, and the luxurious hotels and casinos in the 'Las Vegas of the Orient'.

The Friendship Bridge was prefabricated in nearby Chinese shipyards. A fourth bridge connecting the peninsula and Taipa is currently under construction as the island's transformation continues.







When built, the Friendship Bridge was important for improving the mobility in the territory of Macao but also, to no lesser extent, as a political symbol of the cooperation between Portugal and China

The immaterial dimension of the bridge as a link between the past and the future was counterbalanced by the harsh reality of a design-build tender.

The challenge of a functional, aesthetically pleasing and yet economic crossing that comprises a South Trestle, Inner Bridge over the access channels to the port, Outer Bridge over the two access channels to the Passenger Terminal and North Trestle was addressed by the extensive use of precasting at highly competitive production and transport costs.

The choice has proved to be the right one.







A metro marathon against traffic

Efficient transportation solutions are top priority in Asia's megacities, where traffic and pollution may undermine quality of life if left unchecked. Bangalore, a metropolitan area of 8 million people in the south-west of India, has taken on collective transportation as the solution. Two new metro lines now run through the commercial and residential center of the city, for a total of about 42 kilometers.

The contract concerns a 3.6 km section of the Bangalore Metro's north-south corridor. The tunnels, each 2'515 m long, have a double-drilling configuration for a single track with an internal diameter of 5.6 meters and were excavated using three EPB-TBMs. Conversely, the two tunnels on the north and south sides were bored using the cut-and-cover technique for a total length of 600 m. The project also includes two underground stations, City Market and Chickpete, each 225 m long and constructed in cut-and-cover with bottom-up structures, excavated below the water table. Two TBM shafts, a bypass near the Majestic station, and three safety cross passages complete the job. The tunnel travels under densely urbanized areas and passes through soft, water-saturated soils, including silty sand and clay silt, beneath granite rock.









Bangalore is the capital of Karnataka state, situated in the southern India. It's also known as the Silicon Valley of India, with a reputation for being a happening and vibrant city

It attracts a young and ambitious workforce eager to pursuing IT careers and explore entrepreneurial ventures.

In an attempt to decongest this ever-expanding city, authorities decided to implement a metro line. It was a great opportunity for us to design the underground part of the north-south corridor of the Bangalore Metro. Participating in the design and execution phases was an unforget-table experience, almost like fiction for us to see an underground line be built in India. When the project was commissioned, it was the first metro line in the southern part of India and considered an engineering marvel, on par with any modern metro in the world.





New Assiut Barrage

The New Asyut Barrage is one of the largest water infrastructure projects recently built on the Nile River. The dam replaces the ancient barrage, built in 1909. Its purpose is to secure the water needs of present and future generations, while enhancing and regulating irrigation in Middle Egypt. 






Where planes and the economy take off

BBT – Brenner Base Tunnel

The Brenner Base Tunnel (BBT) is the high-speed rail link between Italy and Austria. It will cross the Alps along the new European rail corridor called Scandinavia-Mediterranean and will be a paramount corridor for the European economy and mobility. With a length of more than 55 km (64 km including the existing Innsbruck railway bypass), this is one of the longest tunnels in the world. The BBT project comprises two twin single-track tunnels and an exploratory tunnel located 12 metres below the main tunnels. The latter will be connected by cross-passages every 333 metres. The system is completed by 3 underground emergency stops 20 km apart and 4 access tunnels. In total, the project comprises more than 220 km of tunnels, and crosses various alpine geological units with very heterogeneous conditions and high overburden till 1700 m, which posed particular technical and design challenges. 50% of the total excavation will be done by TBM and 50% by conventional methods. At the south portal the tunnel undercrosses the Isarco River using the ground freezing technique. ARX is playing a major role in the project, participating of the main construction lots both in Austria and Italy.

Kühtai Pumped Storage Power Plant

The expansion of the existing Sellrain-Silz power plant group involves the construction of a dam (Kühtai reservoir) and a penstock to the existing Finstertal reservoir. PoLuMe N2 Enhancement Lugano Sud Mendrisio

The PoLuMe project involves expanding the N2 highway section between Lugano and Mendrisio by constructing a dynamic third lane, active only during peak hours. The total length of 19.8 km is divided into: embankment 14.9 km, structures 1.85 km, tunnel 3.05 km. This project significantly improves mobility in the southern part of the Canton of Ticino and strengthens the broader connection between Switzerland and Italy.

This new 17 km tunnel will be situated 40 meters east of the existing one and primarily ex-cavated using a TBM with a diameter of 12,4 m. The project includes the construction of a 5 km South Access Tunnel with a shielded TBM of 7,4 m diameter, and the excavation of lo-gistic works using explosives for a 300 m section with a cross-section of 180 M2. Additionally, 7,5 million t of excavated material will be repurposed for concrete aggregates, Airolo roofing, and the renaturation of the Reuss delta in Canton Uri.







See-Infra events frozen lake St. Moritz

St. Moritz is a well-known tourist destination in the heart of the Swiss Alps. Every winter, several international events take place on the frozen lakes. Various preparatory works and ice layer monitoring services are necessary to ensure the safety of these events. Assessment of the ice begins as soon as Lake St. Moritz freezes over – initial visual tests are followed by a series of measurements using different methods. Quantitative monitoring commences when the ice reaches a thickness of 6 centimeters, at measurement points spread out across the lake.




