You will be an instrumental member of our small team in Luxembourg is small (~20 people) and will focus on the single objective of building reliable, performing, and cost-effective products for upcoming satellites, deep-space smallsats and landers. We operate following a hybrid model that aims to fuse the rapid development and commercial processes of a NewSpace company, while attaining a higher degree of quality assurance in the end product.

You would take the responsibility for the **development**, **qualification and improvement of various flight electronics** and their supporting GSE.

- Familiarity with relevant industry standards (e.g. ECSS & IPC)
- Ability to build and rework electronics assemblies (including SMT soldering)
- Practical experience running test campaigns (TVAC, vibration, radiation, extreme temperatures)
- Relevant CAD experience (Altium used in-house for eCAD, thermal FEA and mCAD a plus)
