







### Underwriting philosophy



### Momentum Retail Life Insurance claim statistics for 2022 (claim amounts)




The total amount paid by Momentum Retail Life Insurance in 2022 was **31% lower** than the previous year. When considering Myriad alone, the total payouts were **30% lower**. This decline can primarily be attributed to a reduction in COVID-19 claims. It is encouraging to observe that overall claims are gradually aligning with our anticipated long-term trend.









### Youngest and oldest claimants

- The youngest claimant was a 25-year-old male who died in a motor vehicle accident (MVA).




#### Death claims by gender







The largest amount paid for a death claim was **R84.8 million.**The cause of death was a **stroke.** 

### Death claims by age and gender









In 2022 unnatural deaths caused by MVAs increased by 17%, murder by 72%, and surgery by 63%. Suicides declined by 7%.

If we look at young lives, those under 30, we find that 67% of their unnatural deaths were related to MVAs.

Unnatural deaths increased by 11% year-on-year.



### Terminal illness claims


- Altogether 47 terminal-illness claims were paid out.
- A total of R120 million was paid out.
- Altogether 89% of terminal-illness claims were because of cancer.
- In total, 72% of terminal-illness claims paid out in 2022 were for men.
- For terminal illness the average age at the time of claim was 59.

### Youngest and oldest claimants

- The youngest person was a 38-year-old man due to colon cancer.
- The oldest claimant was an 84-year-old man due to skin cancer.




### Terminal illness claims by age and gender




# Lump sum disability claims

#### Lump sum disability claim causes



- Cancer-related claims are more often linked to the functional impairment definitions typically for stage III and IV cancers.
- Musculoskeletal events that lead to a permanent disability claim are typically very serious chronic neck and back pain (e.g. caused by cervical spondylosis), despite medical interventions.
- For nervous-system-related claims, the biggest cause is associated with strokes (44%), Parkinson's disease (12%), Alzheimer's disease, and dementia (7%).


#### Lump sum disability claims by gender



Most lump sum disability claimants were in the age band 51 - 60.







#### Youngest and oldest claimants

- The oldest claimant was a 73-year-old male (physical impairment benefit) for loss of hearing.
- The youngest claimant was a 25-year-old male for traumatic amputation of his left hand after an MVA (25% severity under the Functional Impairment Benefit).




### Main causes of claims by gender






#### **Critical illness claim causes**








#### Youngest and oldest claimants

- Our two youngest claimants were both 25-year-olds. The first was a musculoskeletal claim: Loss/loss of use of a leg above the knee or an arm above the elbow. The second was for cancer: Non-Hodgkin's disease.
- Our oldest claimant was an 80-year-old male for prostate cancer.



#### Age at the time of cancer claim




# Critical illness claims (continued)

### Critical illness claims for children

- Altogether 54 child critical illness claims were paid.
- A total of 34 unique children were affected.
- Altogether 17 children received two payouts (one from each parent's critical illness cover).
- Five claims under Breadth of Cover Guarantee®.

#### Child critical illness claim causes




#### Breadth of Cover Guarantee® claims

- A total payout of R16.3 million was made under the Breadth of Cover Guarantee®.





### Income protection claims by gender















### Youngest and oldest claimants

- The youngest claimant was a 25-year-old male for pyeloplasty to correct a ureteropelvic junction obstruction (Temporary Income Protector).




## **Longevity Protector® claims**

- A total of 20 new claims triggered in 2022.
- Three new claims became payable in 2022.



• The **youngest client** to have a Longevity Protector® – Disability payout triggered in 2022 was a **29-year-old male.** This means he will start to receive additional **payouts every five years after his initial claim was paid.** 







## **Longevity Protector® claims (continued)**
