2. English – Our value for this month is kindness. It has been more difficult to get out the house if you are an older member of public and it can sometimes be lonely. Write a letter to a 'grandfriend', this could be your grandparent, a neighbour or another member of your family, and tell them about all the exciting things you have been up to since you've been home. Remember how to lay out a letter when you are writing and make sure to add adjectives to make it even more interesting. If you would like to send your letter to someone

else, you could sign up to 'Loving Letters for Grandfriends'.

3. Maths – When we were learning about The Great Fire of London, we learnt about Samuel Pepys and his diary. Samuel Pepys write in a code so that it was tricky to work out what it said. Have a go at creating your own secret code. First give each letter of the alphabet a number. Once you have done this think of a word you would like to write. For each letter think of a number sentence that gets to the correct number for the letter. For example; if the word was amazing and A is 14, I could use the number sentence $10 + 2 =$, or $7 \times 2 =$, or even $20 - 6 =$. Can you get someone else to try and crack your code and work out what the word is?

4. Science/DT – Think about an animal you have learnt about recently. Where do they live? Why do you think they live there? Every animal has adapted to live in a certain place. Find out more about your chosen animal's habitat and any features the animal has to survive there. For example; a polar bear has a thick layer of fat and fur to keep it warm and a chameleon can change its colour to blend in with its surroundings. Once you have researched your animal's habitat have a go at creating their habitat inside a box.

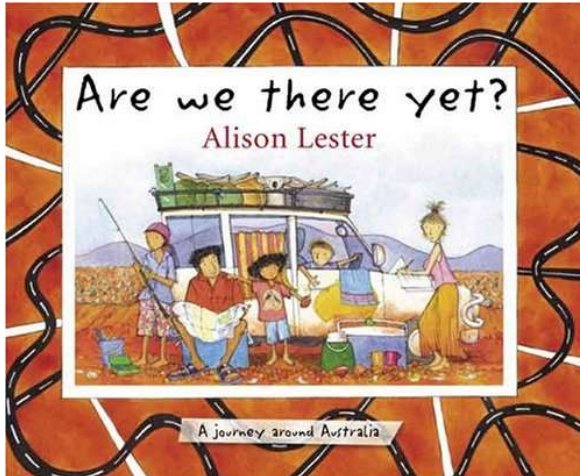
Have a think about the following questions and remember to explain and show your working.

- Count in 2s. Are all the numbers even? Describe the pattern.
 - Add together 2 even numbers. Is the answer odd or even? Try it with other even numbers, is it the same? Explain your thinking.
 - Sam says; "If I do this sum; even + even + odd, I always get an even number." Is Sam right? Show your working.
2. English – We are thinking about homophones. Homophones are two words that are spelt differently but sound the same. Wear and where are homophones, can you think of any more?
