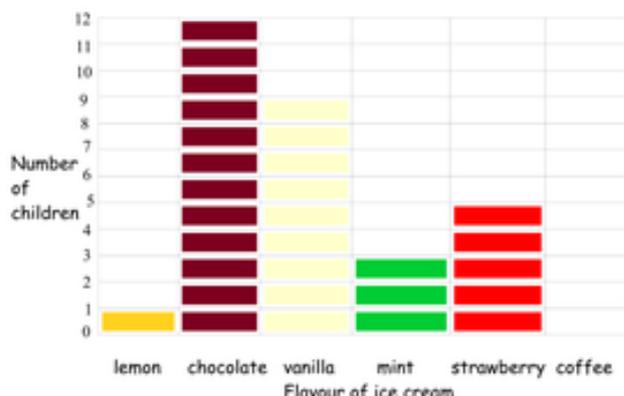
Offline learning activities

1. **Maths/ Computing** - Statistics - Ask your friends and family what their favourite fruit is and record the information in a tally chart. Then use this information to create a bar chart. See the example below to help you.

Once you have made your graph, see if you can answer the following questions

1. What is the **most popular** fruit?

2. What is the **least popular** fruit?
3. Did **more** people prefer apples or bananas? (*you may need to change the names of the fruit, depending on what has been included in your data*)
4. What is the **difference** between the number of people who liked grapes and strawberries? (*you may need to change the names of the fruit, depending on what has been included in your data*)

2. **English** - This week we would like you to have a go at writing your own acrostic poem. Here is an example using the words Ice Cream

It's my favourite food
Cold as the inside of a fridge
Every sunny day

Can't wait
Running to the van
Empy out the money
'Any sauce on that, love?
Mmmmmm, yummy!

The first letter of each line spells out the poem's theme vertically. Acrostic poems do not have to rhyme. Have a go at writing an acrostic poem on the theme of butterflies. It may help to write down as many words as you can think of to do with butterflies, before you start writing. There is a template at the bottom of this flyer for you to use or feel free to create your own. We would love to see your poems!

3 **PE** - This week would have been our *Get Active* week including our Fun Run and Sports Days. As this can no longer take place, we will be having a virtual get active week instead, with a different activity each day for the children to challenge themselves with. At the bottom of this flyer is information about daily activities that the children can take part in. It would be great to see photos and videos of what the children do!

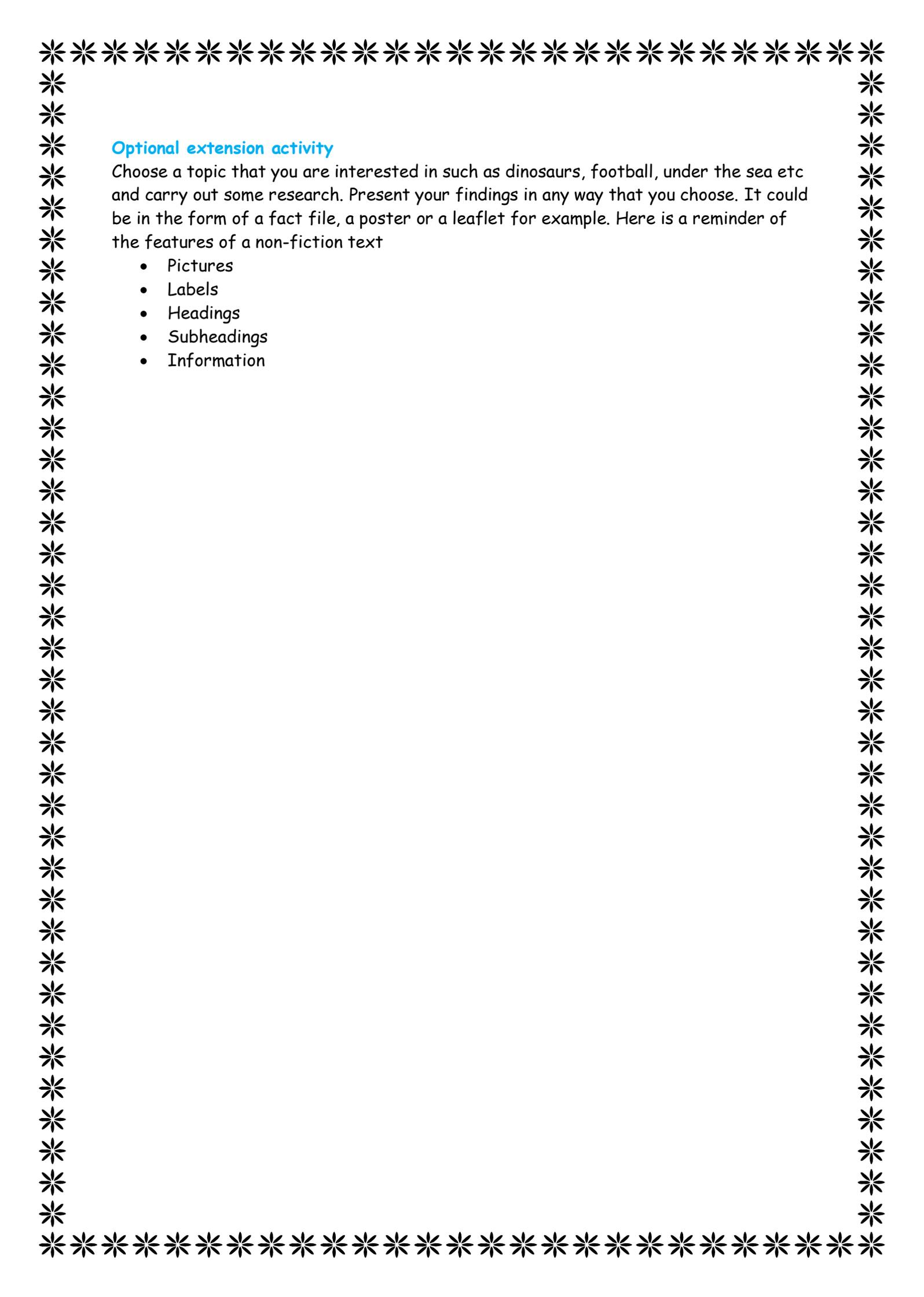

- Information

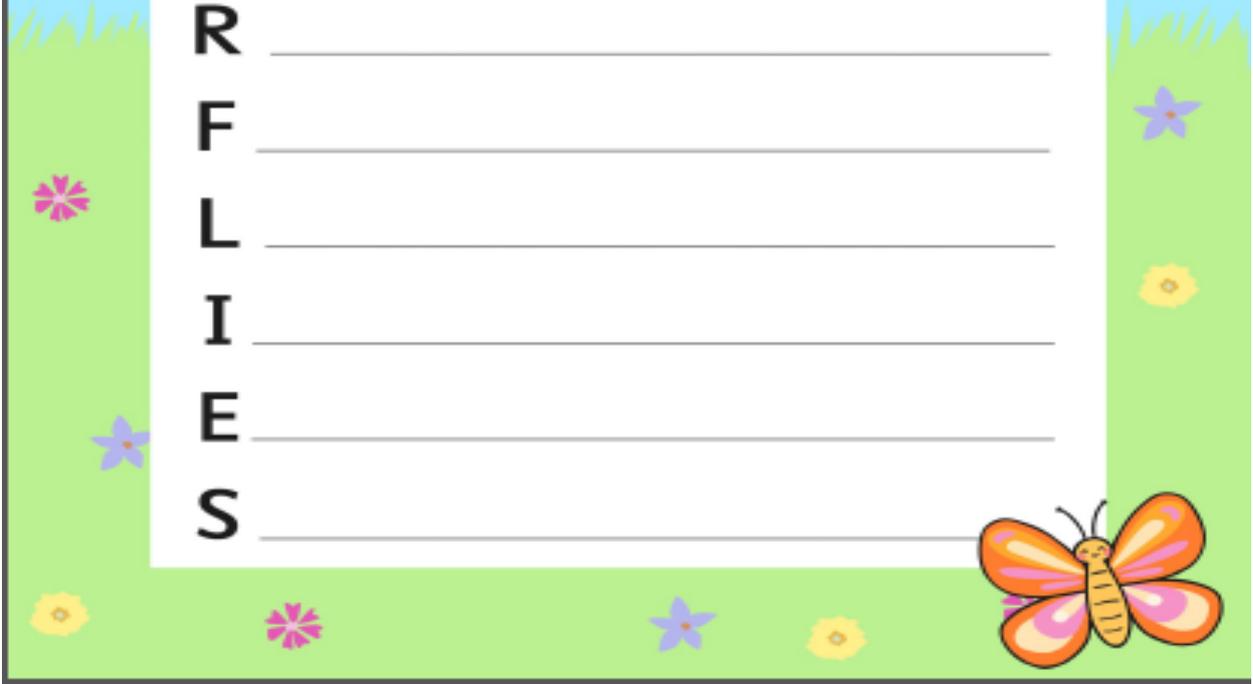
