**CHAT**

**PLAY**

**Online:**

**Literacy** – <http://www.crickweb.co.uk/Early-Years.html> Listen to the sound and match it to the picture that starts with the same sound.

**Phonics** – <https://www.ictgames.com/phonicsPop/index.html> Use this game to help you identify some of the sounds you have learnt this year. Start with set one but you can practise the other sounds too if you would like to.

**Offline:**

**Maths** - Number splat – Adult to write numbers 0 – 10 on pieces of paper and scatter them on the floor/a table. If your child needs a visual prompt, add the amount of dots to each number. Adult to shout a number, children to jump on the number/splat the number. When finished order the numbers and jump along the number line you have made while saying the numbers.



**Finger skills** - Practice threading cheerio's onto string to make a necklace. Or go into the garden and collect stones using tweezers, these sorts of activities strengthen the muscles in your fingers in preparation for writing.



**Phonics** – Have a go at playing animal bingo, using the bingo grid at the end of this document. Can you make the different animal noises? When an adult makes the different animal noises, can you name the animal that makes that sound? Name the animal together. Explore making the sounds in different ways, for example: loud and quiet, slow and fast.

### READ

Remember to read every day. It could be a book, magazine, recipe, or instructions. Try to include some time in the day to share stories together.

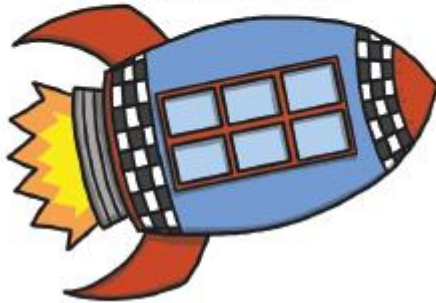
