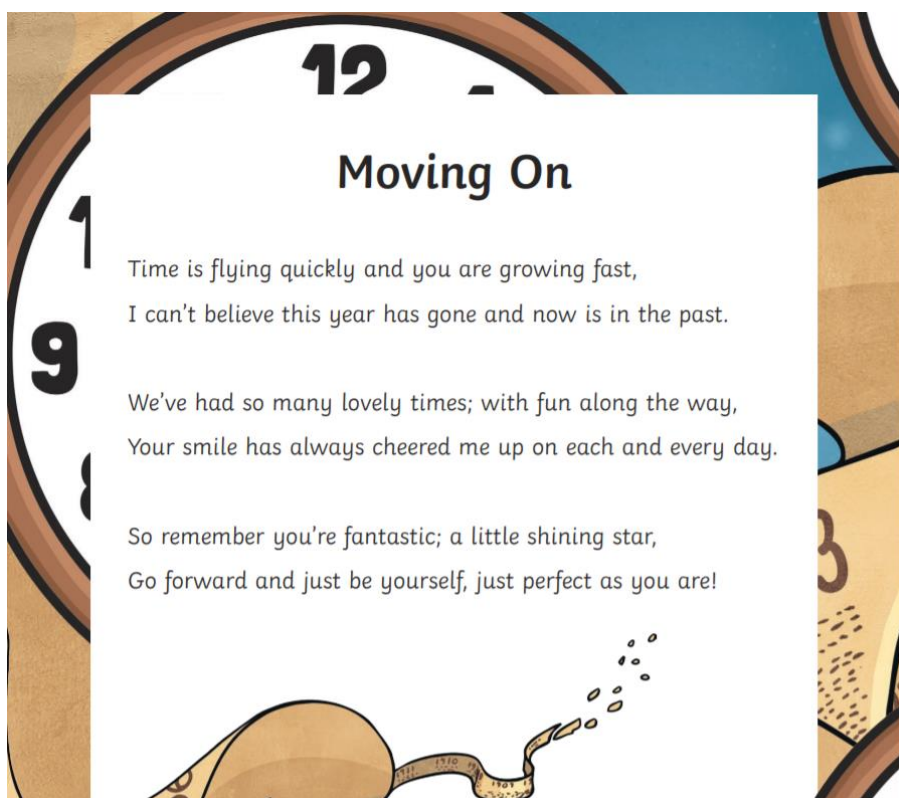
### Offline Learning Activities
