Quel temps fait-il?



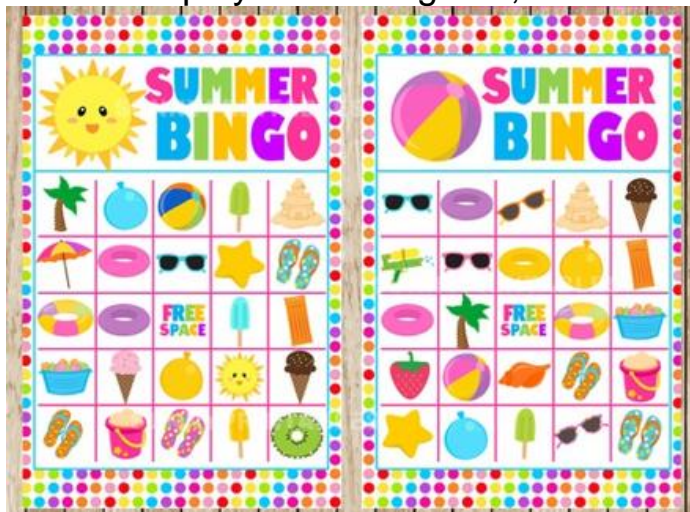

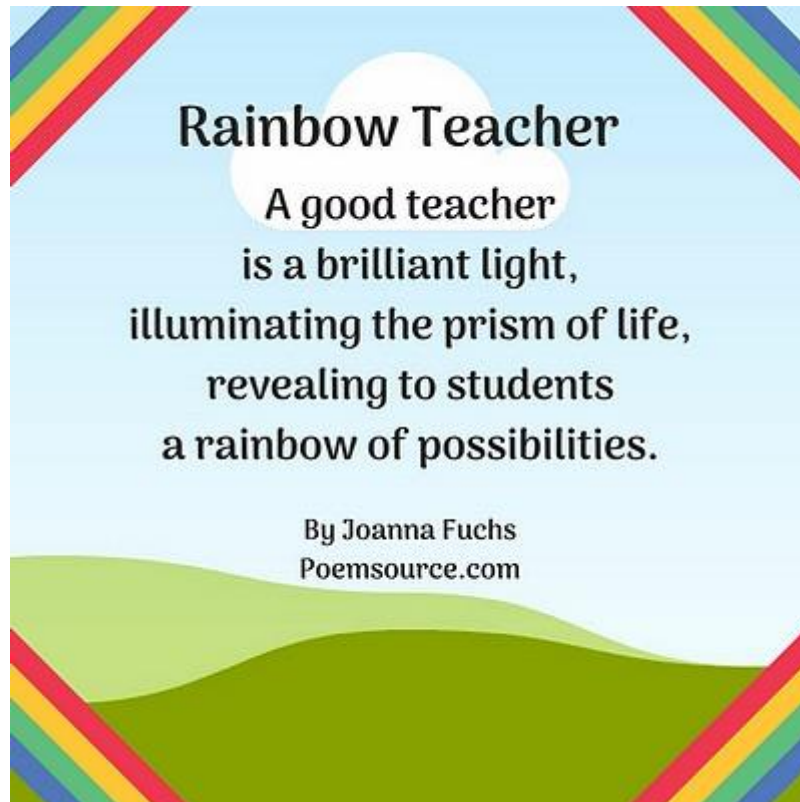
Handwriting
