Dear Parents and Carers

We have had an initial indication of the Year 6 test results back this week and we are **DELIGHTED!** The final levels cannot be determined until thresholds are published next week, but I wanted to share this with you at the earliest opportunity. So, an early conservative analysis shows that **85% have achieved Level 4 in Reading, 80% in Writing and 85% in Mathematics!** In addition, Level 5 results are high, with 32% in Reading and 35% in Maths. These are fantastic results – the children have achieved them by having an excellent attitude to learning this year so **WELL DONE YEAR 6!** This is a credit to the whole school and all the staff, who have been working so hard this year, but a particular 'well done' must also go to the Year 6 team of teachers and teaching assistants!

TAEKWONDO

Fairlands Taekwondo club recently had their second official club grading test, watched by some very supportive parents. Twelve students were promoted to yellow belt, one to green tag and one to green belt. The children put on an excellent display of fighting techniques and performed very tough memorised sequences of 20 movements. The green belt student also had to break a board with an elbow and a kick.

The next step on their journey is more fighting techniques using protective equipment to be able to practice them with each other and to learn another sequence of 20 movements for their next grading at the end of the year. Some students who weren't quite ready will be taking a test in a few weeks to catch-up, including more candidates for yellow belt and yellow tag.

Master Jeffries said after the grading "Fairlands Taekwondo's technical standard is really progressing well. The students are all putting in full effort to learn some very difficult techniques, while understanding that this is a sport and martial art and not to be used outside of the training sessions. I'm sure we're all looking forward to seeing Team GB Taekwondo compete at the London 2012 Olympic Games in August".

Hertfordshire Libraries are getting ready for the 14th National Summer Reading Challenge. It is a great way to promote the importance of reading throughout the holidays, improving children's confidence and encourages children to be ready to learn when they return to school.

This year's Summer Reading Challenge is called 'Story Lab' and is a celebration of story and the imagination. It centres around four children at a five-sided hi-tech HQ that attracts stories from all over the world and sends them spinning throughout the city – and beyond.

The Reading Challenge is designed for children of all ages and reading abilities. Each child is challenged to read 6 library books of their choice during the summer holidays, with collectable incentives, plus an exclusive Story Lab zip tag, certificate and medal for every child who completes the challenge.

This year the challenge is also linked to the Olympic Games, as you read books, you progress through bronze, silver and gold stages, collecting stickers to complete your Story Lab.

From **Saturday 7th July** you can collect your very own Story Lab Pack from all Hertfordshire public libraries, including mobiles. The sooner you collect your pack, the longer you have to read! Happy reading!
