**Year 5 – Science, RSE and Health Education**

After half term we will be delivering the following curriculum content to Year 5 children:

Science Curriculum	RSE and Health Education
Children should be taught about different types of reproduction, including sexual and asexual reproduction in plants and sexual reproduction in animals. Pupils should draw a timeline to indicate stages in the growth and development of humans. Ask questions about puberty with confidence.</p> <p><b>Learning Intention</b> To understand male and female puberty changes in more detail</p> <p><b>Learning Outcomes</b> Understand how puberty affects the reproductive organs. Describe how to manage physical and emotional changes.</p>
