## HAND, FOOT AND MOUTH

We have had a couple of cases of Hand, Foot and Mouth in school. This viral infection begins by presenting as cold and cough symptoms. It is at this stage that it is most contagious. Once fully presented, your child may have a rash on the palms of their hands and soles of their feet, and may have ulcers in their mouth. The Health Protection Agency advises that your child need only be absent from school while they are feeling unwell. It is not necessary for children to be absent from school until all the symptoms have disappeared.
