Continued profitable growth amid challenging market conditions, driven by perfumes business, Ultrasun and The Glenturret – operating revenue of EUR 87.7m, up 8% excl. exceptional income in H1 2022

2 Costs impacted by higher energy costs, but also by persistent overall inflation with higher production and salary costs

EBIT of EUR 2.5m (vs. EUR 6.3m in H1 2022 excl. exceptional income) with EBIT margin of 2.8%; net Group profit of EUR 0.6m - improved business momentum in Q2 also thanks to price increases

Continued solid balance sheet with equity ratio of 47.8% at end-June 2023

For 2023, Lalique Group now expects sales growth in the upper single-digit % range and profitability at EBIT level to be higher than in the first half of 2023, but well below full-year 2022


- Operating revenue up 5% vs. H1 2022, or up 8% excl. exceptional income of CHF 1.7m in H1 2022
- Costs reflect inflation-related salary increases, increased yearon-year FTE levels of +7% and intensified marketing and sales activities in line with revenue growth
- EBIT of EUR 2.5m vs. EUR 8.0m in H1 2022, or EUR 6.3m excl. exceptional income

H1 2023 EBIT impacted by higher production costs and increased operating expenses





- Growth of operating revenue due to sales recovery in largely all markets did not result in EBIT increase
- Revenue growth more than offset by decreased gross profit margin of 53.5% vs 57.7% in H1 2022, mainly driven by higher energy and production costs
- Increased staff costs and other operating expenses reflecting inflationrelated higher salary expenses, revenue growth as well as business expansion





Lalique segment: solid sales, but lower profitability









- Segment revenue of EUR 45.2m, stable vs. H1 2022 excl. exceptional income
- Lalique Parfums: sales down by 3% compared to strong prior-year period
- Lalique Crystal: operating revenues around H1 2022 levels; production and sales subdued in H1 due to technical problems with new melting furnace
- Gastronomy/hospitality: operating revenue up 7% particularly reflecting strong growth at Château Lafaurie-Peyraguey Hôtel & Restaurant
- Lower gross profit margin (56.8% vs 61.1% in H1 2022) due to higher energy and production costs in particular
- Segment costs up 11%
- As a result, EBIT down to EUR -1.7m, from EUR 3.8m in H1 2022
- Q2 2023 profitability reflecting improved business momentum and price increases

Ultrasun: continued recovery









- Segment revenue up 17%
- Strong performance driven in particular by the booming UK market (up 21% vs. H1 2022)
- Decrease in segment costs by 17% due to normalised marketing activities in H1 2023, which were excessive in H1 2022 after the pandemic (free goods, samples for new POS)
- EBIT reached EUR 2.4m in H1 2023 vs. EUR 1.1m in H1 2022

Jaguar: strong sales growth









- Jaguar with operating revenue growth of 17% vs. H1 2022
- US, India and Benelux as strong sales growth drivers
- Profitability impacted by higher component and production costs as well as increased personnel expenses and other operating costs
- EBIT decreased to EUR 1.4m

The Glenturret: strong growth of whisky sales









- Whisky sales noticeably increased in H1 2023 (up 34%) as new whisky range was launched later than originally planned in H2 2022
- Visitor centre, refurbished Café and new Lalique Restaurant contributed positively, with significantly higher amounts of visitors
- Overall cost increase reflects higher business volume as well as higher personnel costs due to inflation-related salary increases and increase in headcount
- EBIT reached EUR -0.9m in H1 2023, break-even expected end of 2023

Other brands: sales growth offset by higher costs








- Bentley: operating revenue down by 16% vs. H1 2022, mainly due to component supply difficulties which led to out of stock situations
- Parfums Grès: 5% sales growth approaching pre-pandemic level
 driven by European and Latin American key markets
- Parfums Samouraï: 17% sales growth approaching pre-pandemic level – driven by Japan key market launches of new innovations accompanied by relaxation of Covid-19-restrictions
- Brioni: accelerated growth following launch of Brioni Éclat and Essentiel
- Lalique Beauty Services: operating revenue up 16% as a result of sales growth in the perfumes business, with increasing capacity utilization in the course of the semester
- Segment EBIT decreased to EUR 1.8m, reflecting higher operating and personnel costs

- Operating cash flow decreased to EUR -9.2m vs. EUR
 11.3m in H1 2022, mainly driven by significantly increased stock levels as well as higher energy costs
- Non-current financial liabilities have increased by EUR
 6.5m, reflecting the adjustment to consider liabilities resulting from licence agreements as financial liabilities.
- Increase in property, plant and equipment reflects mainly investments in crystal, perfume and whisky facilities in order to increase production capacities
- Net debt / EBITDA ratio increased to 4.4 vs. 1.7 in H1 2022
- Strong equity ratio at 47.8% (2022: 50.0%)

Business Priorities and Outlook



Business priorities for H2 2023



- Lalique Group will continue to consistently implement its diversification strategy and is convinced the breadth of its business is a strength in a global economic environment characterized by uncertainties
- While energy costs will remain high in H2 2023, Lalique Group expects a significant decrease in energy costs from next year on the back of forward contracts concluded for 2024 and 2025; due to general inflation, personnel and other operating expenses are expected to remain at elevated levels in H2 2023 and beyond
- Selected product launches and projects
 - Perfumes: Roll-out of new launches, including new Lalique masculine pillar, and continued leverage of new distribution set-ups in Middle East, Asia and Latin America to further improve market presence across brands
 - Ultrasun: Re-development of Chinese market with newly appointed distribution partner and preparation of U.S. market entry following successful trademark registration proceedings
 - Lalique: Global launch of Art collection with the Magritte Foundation and roll-out of "Rose Nebula" crystal collection as well as ongoing efforts to increase production capacity at the manufacturing site
 - The Glenturret: Focus on further growth in whisky sales by volume and value; planned launch of Aberturret Gin in Autumn 2023
- Projects currently ongoing but planned for 2024 and beyond
 - Re-launch of silk label Fabric Frontline
 - Roll-out of first fragrances under licensing agreement with global fashion brand Superdry
 - Opening of Villa Florhof

Financial outlook



Full-year 2023 guidance:

- Lalique Group now expects sales growth in the upper single-digit % range (previous guidance: low ten percentage range)
- Profitability at EBIT level expected to be higher than in the first half of 2023, but well below full-year 2022 (previous guidance: slightly below 2022)

Mid-term targets:

- Lalique Group continues to expect annual mid-single-digit % growth in local currencies
- With regard to profitability, the ambition to gradually increase the EBIT margin to 9-11% is maintained, but due to inflation trends, achievement of the target range may be delayed until 2026

Our short- and mid-term outlooks are subject to unforeseeable events such as a significant worsening of the global economic environment.




