1 Further growth in a year of significant investment in the breadth of the diversified business

Sales up 5% to EUR 143.5m, driven by Ultrasun, almost all perfume brands and Lalique crystal, impacted by significant decline at Lalique Parfums in the Middle East

EBIT of EUR 1.4m reflecting business expansion (Asia, mainly China, Japan), restructuring (USA) and acquisition costs (The Glenturret); EBIT margin of 1.0% or 1.8% excluding acquisition-related costs

4 Completed capital increase with gross proceeds of CHF 48m

Continued strong balance sheet with equity ratio of 50.1%, solid liquidity position

- Solid operating revenue growth of 5% (5% in local currencies) driven by positive development of Ultrasun, almost all perfume brands and Lalique crystal, impacted by significant decline at Lalique Parfums in Middle East
- Operating expenses reflect international expansion, restructuring in the US and acquisition costs of The Glenturret
- Reduction of other operating expenses is due to first-time application of IFRS 16
- EBIT of EUR 1.4m

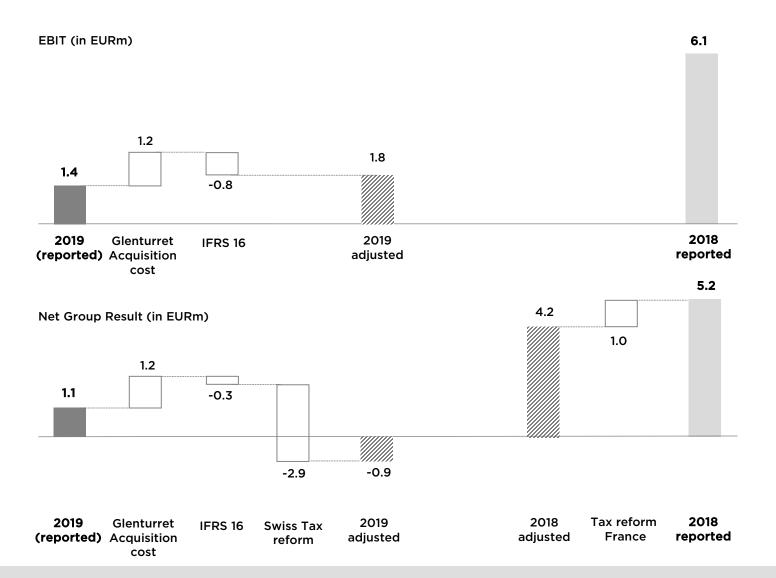

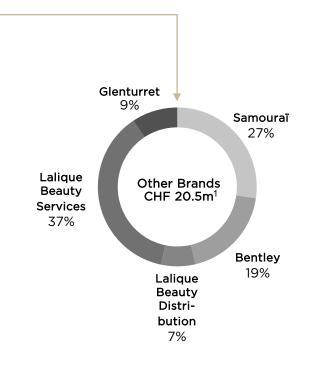


- EUR 1.2m impact of Glenturret acquisition costs on 2019 EBIT and net result
- Previous year: EUR 6.1m including extraordinary income of EUR 2.4m related to legal proceedings
- Initial application of IFRS 16 with positive effect of EUR 0.8m on 2019 EBIT (EUR 0.3m on net group result)
- Swiss tax reform required revaluation of deferred tax positions leading to additional deferred tax expenses (EUR 2.1m), as well as allowing partial step-up of tax values leading to deferred tax income (EUR 5.0m), in 2019
- 2018 had been positively impacted the company tax reform in France (EUR 1.0m)

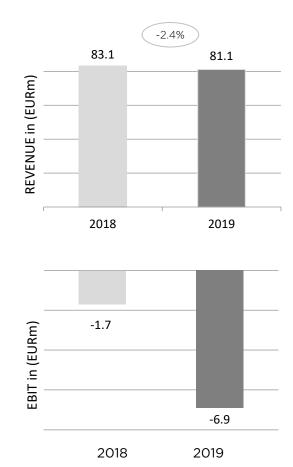

Lalique segment: strong sales in crystal business but overall performance impacted by decline in perfumes

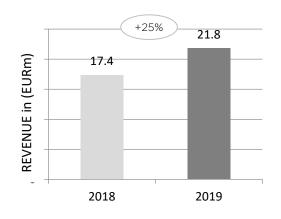


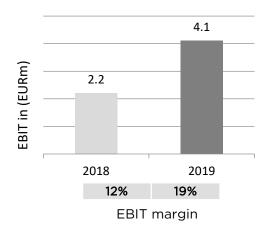


- Total sales stable excluding the extraordinary litigation compensation of EUR 2.4m in 2018
- Crystal business (decorative items, interior design, art, jewellery): up
 7%, with strong growth in China and Russia in particular
- Perfumes: down 18%, due to difficult market and operating conditions in the Middle East including Iran embargo as previously communicated
- Gastronomy/Hospitality: continued good occupancy rates and increased EBIT
- Costs up 4% in total, reflecting planned business expansion namely in Asia and restructuring costs in the US
- EBIT down to EUR -6.9m

Ultrasun segment: continued strong sales with excellent growth in China, Switzerland and the Netherlands



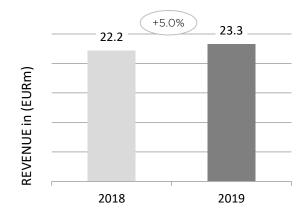


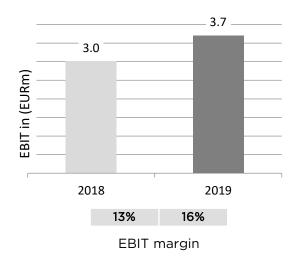


- Sales up 25% with higher gross profit margin
- Costs up 19% reflecting higher personnel costs and marketing expenditures due to business expansion
- Continued broad-based growth with consistent performance in UK, excellent sales in China, Switzerland and the Netherlands, and solid contributions from new markets Taiwan and Korea
- Focus on pharmacies and drugstores continues to prove successful
- EBIT increased to EUR 4.1 m and EBIT margin further rose to 19%

Jaguar segment: strong year for Lalique Group's largest perfume brand



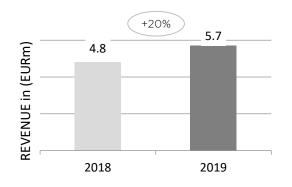


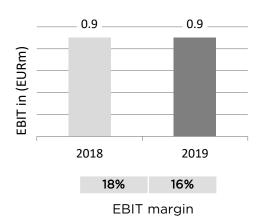


- Sales up 5%, reflecting continued growth in Europe, North America and Asia, more than offsetting decrease in the Middle East
- EBIT increased to EUR 3.7m
- EBIT margin improved to 16%, also reflecting improved operational efficiency thanks to the new automated filling facility at Lalique Beauty Services

Grès segment: sales rebound driven by key markets





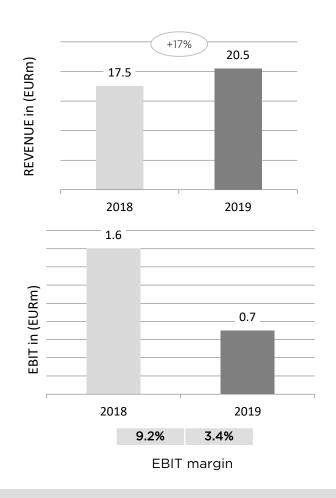


- Sales up 20%, driven by key markets such as Spain, France, some Latin American countries and Israel
- Positive contributions by launch of "Cabochard chérie" and relaunch of "Cabochard", originally introduced in 1959
- EBIT remained stable, EBIT margin decreased slightly

Other brands segment: solid growth, improved operating profitability, EBIT reflects The Glenturret integration

- Bentley Fragrances sales up 5%, mainly due to higher sales in the US and the UK
- Parfums Samouraï sales up 9% after decline in prior year,
 supported by launch of two new product lines
- The Glenturret, fully integrated in Lalique Group's accounts since its acquisition on 28 March 2019, generated sales of EUR 1.9m from April to December 2019, in line with expectations
- All businesses in the segment, including perfume filling and logistics operation Lalique Beauty Services, improved operational profitability
- EBIT declined by EUR -0.9m, mainly due to acquisition costs of The Glenturret (EUR 1.2m) and costs for rebranding

- Increase in assets of EUR 28.0m, especially in inventories (EUR 12.1m) and intangibles (EUR 22.3m) due to the integration of The Glenturret
- Rights issue generated gross proceeds of CHF 48.0m, which were used to re-finance the Glenturret acquisition (CHF 24.5m) and to increase net cash position
- Improved net debt vs EBITDA ratio as of 31.12.2019 = 2.0 vs 3.0 as of 31.12.2018
- Equity ratio as of 31/12/2019 improved from 39.2 % as of HY to 50.1 % as of year end 2019
- First-time application of IFRS 16 led to an increase in fixed assets (EUR 21.0m) and non-current financial liabilities (EUR 23.0m)

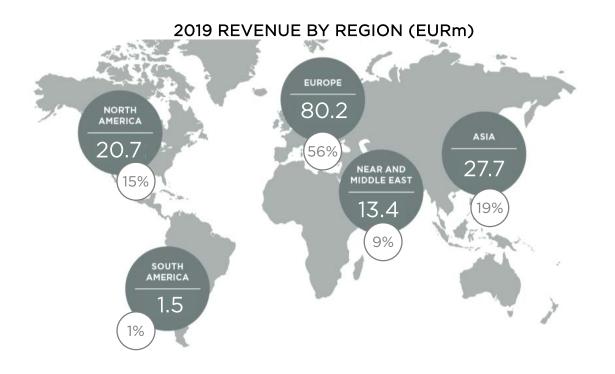

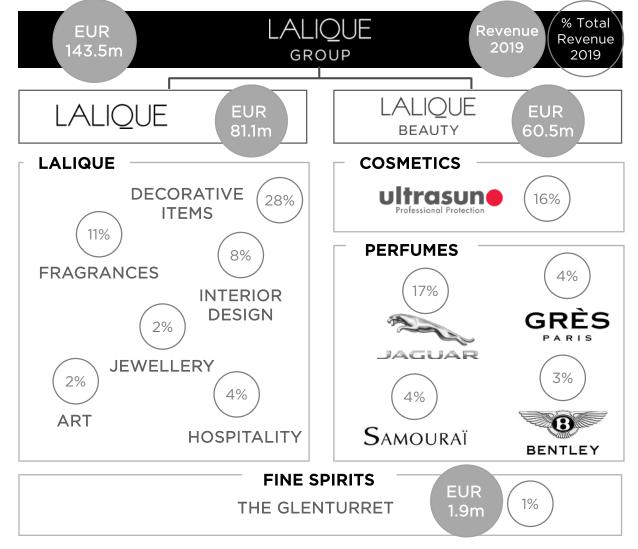

Addressing global Covid-19 situation



Impacts on Lalique Group business

- Developments surrounding Covid-19 pandemic are rapid and unpredictable
- Prior to lockdown measures imposed in Europe, Lalique Group business less affected than expected at the outset of the crisis in China
- Since mid-March, business adversely affected due in particular to closure of sales outlets and interruptions in supply chains
- Additional longer-term secondary effects expected due to economic downturn and impaired consumer confidence
- Overall impact on business will depend on duration of Covid 19-pandemic and related business restrictions as well as pace of economic recovery
- Demand for products for daily use and in lower price segments expected to bounce back more quickly, while it could take longer for luxury products – potentially mitigated in part by Lalique's loyal and less economically sensitive client base

Action plan to mitigate negative impacts

- Protection of health of employees, clients and partners as top priority
- Immediate focus on measures to protect Lalique Group's profitability and strong capital and liquidity position, including:
 - Significant reduction of marketing activities and suspension of launches of new collections and product lines
 - Application for short-time work for majority of employees in France (including production facilities), Zurich and overseas
 - Enhancement of digital marketing and online sales activities
 - Launch preparations for first Brioni perfume planned for Q4 2020 continue as planned
- Board of Directors to propose that no dividend will be paid for 2019
- BoD and EB to waive parts of fixed/variable compensation

Outlook taking into account Covid-19 situation



- Due to unpredictability of further developments, impacts on business can currently not be estimated
- At this stage, it is therefore impossible to provide any financial guidance for 2020
- Furthermore, 2021 outlook depends on pace of economic recovery
- Lalique Group's diversification strategy is expected to be a fundamental strength also in a potential longer-term economic downturn
- The group will continue to consistently implement its strategy, taking into account the development of the Covid-19 situation in its regional activities
- Previously communicated mid-term targets mid-single digit revenue growth in local currencies, gradual increase in EBIT margin to 9%-11% remain in place, but achievement will take more time

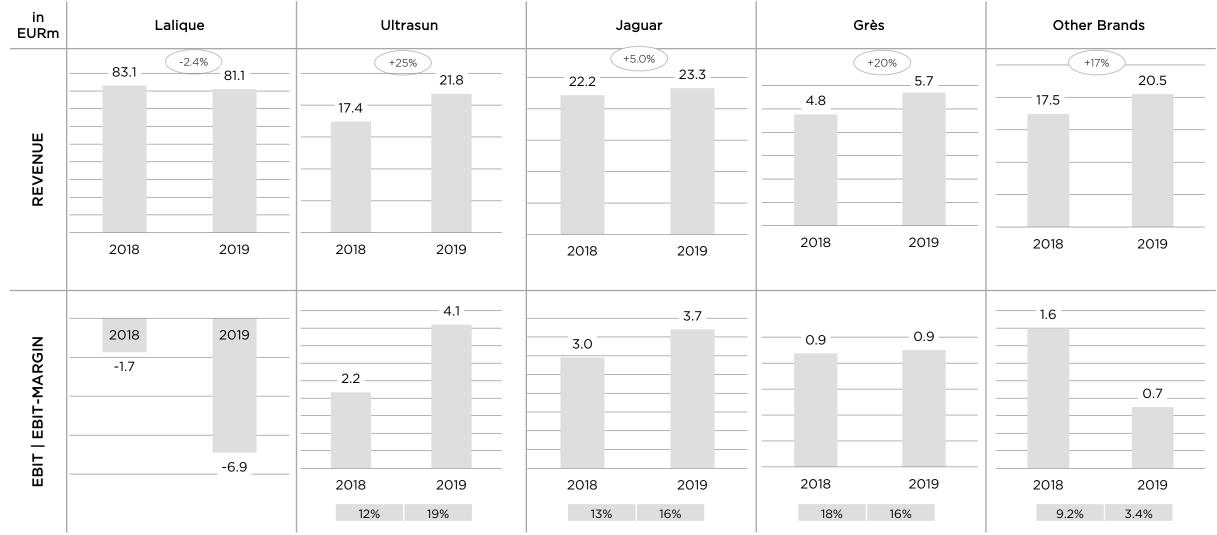

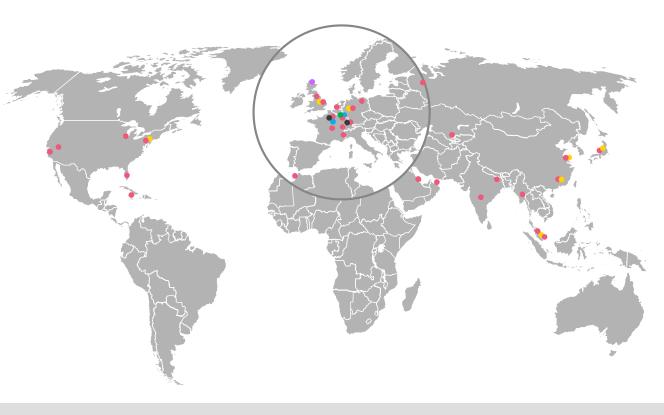
