Overview of 2020



2020 affected by Covid-19 crisis – focus on health protection, business continuity and cost discipline

The Lalique Mûres (blackberries) vase

Measures to combat corona pandemic heavily impacted Lalique Group's activities across segments and regions in 2020, especially retail business due to temporary closure of shops

Priority was on protection of health of employees, clients and partners; production in the manufacturing sites and product deliveries to clients were ensured during lockdowns thanks to strict sanitary concepts

Decline in sales was partly offset by cost-saving measures and introduction of short-time working and other related support measures

Online distribution and digital marketing activities have been expanded, resulting in an increased share of online sales in the perfume and crystal businesses; the Group's restaurants in France had to close for four months overall and introduced takeaway services during week-ends

Selected product launches were realized, including fragrances, a new crystal collection and a new whisky range by The Glenturret; most recently, first fragrance under exclusive Brioni licence was successfully launched in March 2021

Les Compositions Parfumées candles

Operating revenue of EUR 110.7m, down 23% vs 2019 (H1 2020: -30%), reflecting improved sales trends in the second half of the year amid ongoing Covid-19 pandemic

Personnel costs down 19% to EUR 28.7m, and other operating expenses down 24% to EUR 22.9m, reflecting substantial cost savings measures

Profitability impacted by Covid-19 pandemic and one-off effects, namely non-cash impairment charge of EUR 4.3m before tax recognized on Lalique brand value in H1 2020 and litigation provision of EUR 2.4m before tax in H2 2020

EBIT of EUR -12.6m including impairment charge and litigation provision, and EUR -5.9m excluding one-off effects (2019: EUR 1.4m, including EUR 1.2m one-off costs in connection with acquisition of 50% stake in The Glenturret)

Continued solid liquidity and capital positions, with equity ratio of 46.2% at end-2020 vs. 50.1% at end-2019. Cashflow from operations stood at EUR 18.7m vs. EUR 9.5m in 2019

Solid sales trends in Q1 2021 against the back of ongoing Covid-19 situation; for full-year 2021, Lalique Group expects double-digit sales growth, although 2021 revenue likely to be slightly below 2019 pre-pandemic level

Equity ratio

- LALIQUE group
- **Operating revenue** down 23% due to economic implications from global Covid-19 pandemic. Affected was mainly the retail business, while wholesale suffered to a lower degree
- **Personnel costs** and **other operating** expenses reduced through substantial cost savings measures and furlough schemes in most Group entities
- Operating costs included a non-cash impairment of EUR 4.3m on the brand value of Lalique, as well as a provision for a legal case in France in an amount of EUR 2.4m
- EBIT of EUR -12.6m, or EUR -5.9m excluding above-mentioned one-off effects

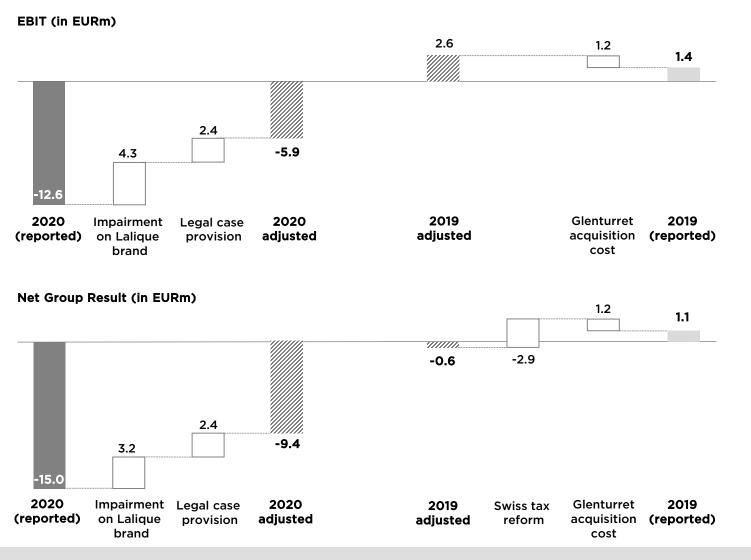

2020:

 Non-cash impairment charge on brand value of Lalique (acquired in 2008), with impact of EUR -4.3m on EBIT and EUR -3.2m (incl. deferred tax) on net Group profit

GROUP

 Provision for a legal case of EUR 2.4m after a French court has called for a reassessment of the legal situation

2019:

- Swiss tax reform required revaluation of deferred tax positions leading to additional deferred tax expenses (EUR 2.1m), as well as allowing partial step-up of tax values leading to deferred tax income (EUR 5.0m)
- Acquisition costs of EUR 1.2m for Glenturret acquisition

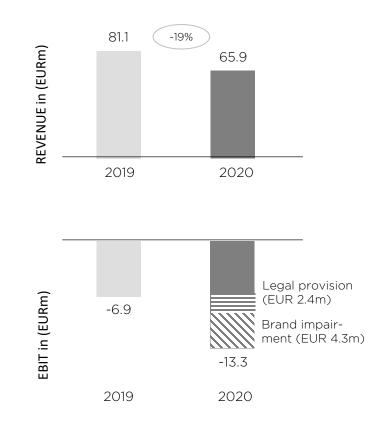

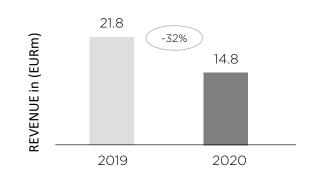

Lalique segment: slightly improved operational LALIOU profitability excluding one-off effects GROUP

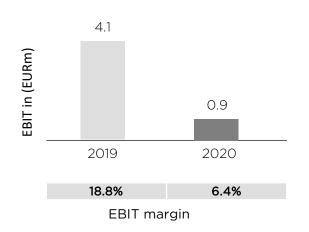


- Sales declined by 25% in perfume business and by 15% in crystal vs 2019; slightly improved sales momentum in perfumes and crystal in 2H versus 1H
- Reduced sales in retail stores (Covid-19 related closures in most countries) were partly compensated by sales through own online channels and to online distributors; in perfumes, online sales doubled to c. 8% of overall sales; in crystal, online sales increased to 8% of retail sales
- Gastronomy/Hospitality establishments closed for more than four months
 overall
- Costs impacted by brand impairment (EUR 4.3m) and legal provision for a legal case in France (EUR 2.4m); excluding these one-off effects, costs were down 19% vs prior year
- EBIT excluding one-off effects was EUR -6.6m, thanks to improved operating results in Japan and China, as well as cost reductions in all other subsidiaries

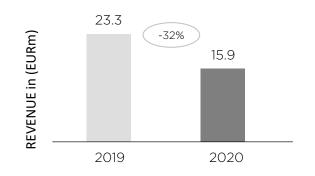
Ultrasun: strongly affected by lockdown as well LALIOUE as year-long travel restrictions but achieved GROUP positive EBIT



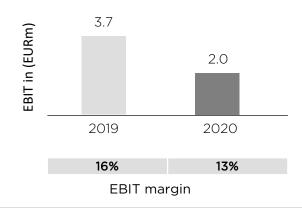
- Operating revenue down -32% as a result of lockdown measures including closing of shops and year-long travel restrictions in most key markets of Ultrasun
- Costs reduced by 15% reflecting furlough measures and cuts in operating expenses
- Focus on pharmacies and drugstores continues to prove successful
- EBIT reduced to EUR 0.9m with an EBIT margin of 6.4%



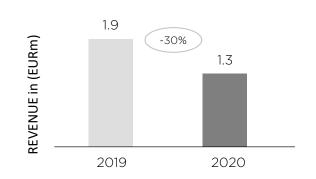
Jaguar: continued strong profitability despite substantial revenue decline



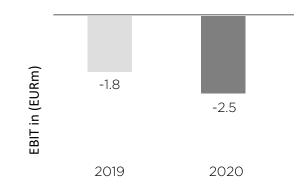
- Operating revenues declined by -32% as a result of business restrictions in the context of the Covid-19 pandemic
- Successful launch of new fragrance in Germany supported sales especially in 2H 2020
- EBIT reached EUR 2.0m
- Profitability remained high with an EBIT margin of 13%



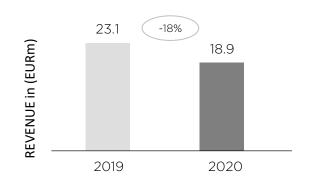
Glenturret: behind plan due to delayed launch of new whisky range and closure of visitor centre



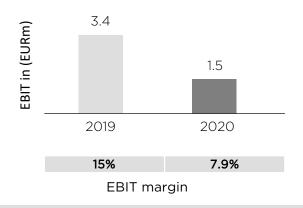
- Operating revenue declined, as launch of new whisky range had to be delayed until autumn 2020
- Visitor centre remained shut for 9 months due to lockdown in the UK
- EBIT stood at EUR -2.5m



Other brands: remained profitable with EBITmargin of 7.9%



- Bentley Fragrances revenue decline was moderate (-5%) thanks to favourable developments in various markets, as well as online
- Parfums Samouraï saw relatively strong decline of revenues (-21%) as Japan was in state of emergency for several months during 2020
- Parfum Grès reported -23% revenues due to challenging situation in key markets such as Spain and the US
- Production of hand sanitizer for third-party clients partly compensated reduced activity at Lalique Beauty Services
- EBIT declined to EUR 1.5m with EBIT margin of 7.9%

- Net cash position increased noticeably by EUR 15.2m to 22.4m reflecting significantly improved working capital (inventories, accounts receivables) as well as Covid credits
- Net debt decreased to EUR 44.9m from EUR 49.9 as at 31.12.2019
- Liquidity ratio improved to 2.0 from 1.8
- Equity ratio remains strong at 46.2% compared to 50.1% as at year end 2019

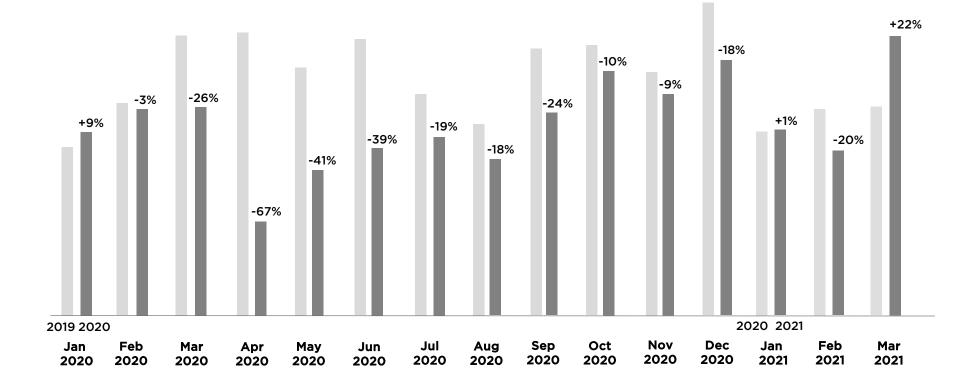


Business Priorities and Outlook



Pleasing sales development in recent months while Covid related risks remain

Group net sales to third parties: monthly deviation versus prior year



• Sharp drop in net sales in March and April 2020

- Slow and steady recovery in Q3 and Q4-2020
- Solid sales development in Q1-2021 despite ongoing Covid-19 pandemic

Business priorities for 2021



- Continued focus on health protection amid persistent Covid-19 pandemic; silver lining thanks to vaccine campaigns
- Continued strict cost management, in line with sales developments and improving business environment
- Selected product launches and projects:
 - First fragrance under new exclusive Brioni licence successfully launched in March 2021
 - Reopening of The Glenturret distillery, including visitor centre and café and shop (planned in April 2021) and the new Lalique fine-dining restaurant headed by Michelin-starred chef Mark Donald (planned in June 2021)
 - Ultrasun: Re-establish sales in key market UK, setup own sales organization in Germany and winning Chinese customers with new product launches
 - Development and launch, in Q3 or Q4-2021, of improved Ultrasun formulas for the Asian region and the Chinese market in particular
- Continued focus on improving profitability in Lalique segment
- Further expansion of digital marketing and online distribution activities for all segments

Financial outlook

LALI<u>O</u>UE group

<u>FY 2021</u>, barring unforeseeable events or a renewed escalation of the pandemic:

- Lalique Group expects double-digit sales growth vs 2020, although revenue for 2021 likely to remain slightly below pre-pandemic level recorded in 2019

<u>Mid-term</u>, from today's perspective:

- Lalique Group anticipates that Covid-19 situation will lead to a delay of around 2-3 years in the achievement of its previously communicated mid-term profitability targets (mid-single-digit revenue growth in local currencies, gradual increase in EBIT margin to 9-11%)





- 2020 business activities heavily impacted by Covid-19 pandemic, although less severely than initially anticipated
- Decline in sales was partly offset by significant cost-saving measures and costs will continue to be tightly managed
- Covid-19 situation is likely to remain unpredictable in 2021, but improved sales trends in Q1 2021
- Liquidity and capital positions remain solid (equity ratio above 46%)
- Focus on improving profitability in Lalique segment, among others in US and Japan markets
- Group diversification strategy maintained with aim to benefit from the broad base of its business segments



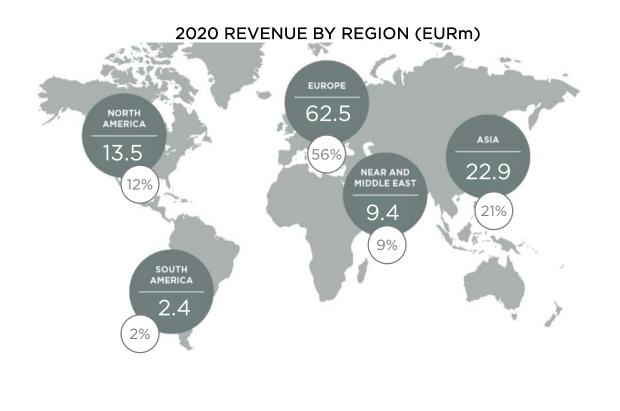

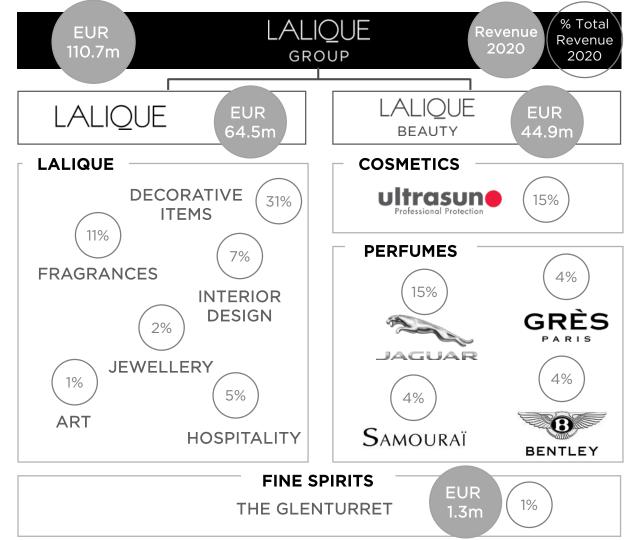


Lalique Group product portfolio reflects diversification strategy

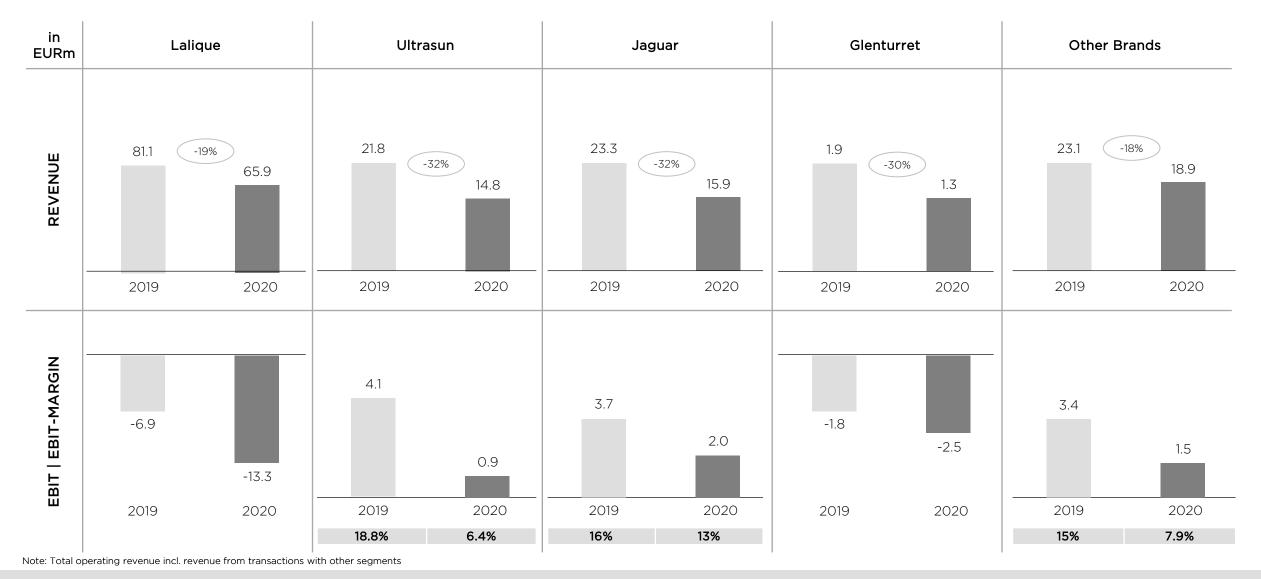
