## 2021 key financial takeaways

6





- Global sales recovered to pre-pandemic levels with operating revenue of EUR 142.0m, up 28% vs. 2020 and almost in line with 2019 (EUR 143.5m)
  - 2 The Lalique segment showed strong growth at a significantly increased profitability
    - Perfume business delivered strong overall performance across most brands
    - The Glenturret whiskey business also reported noticeable sales increase, while sales of Ultrasun products remained below previous year's level
  - Costs reflect continued disciplined cost management and increased business volume; personnel costs up 21%, other operating expenses up 6% (excl. one-off items in 2020)
  - EBIT increased to EUR 9.6m with EBIT margin of 6.8%, significantly exceeding pre-pandemic levels; net Group profit rose to EUR 6.8m in 2021

Lalique Into the Blue collection 2022

- Acquisition of the Château Lafaurie-Peyraguey hotel and restaurant in July 2021 (awarded a second Michelin Star in March 2022)
  - Opening of The Glenturret Lalique Restaurant in Scotland at end-July 2021 (awarded a Michelin star in February 2022 within just seven months of opening)
    - 3 Launch of first two Brioni fragrances in 2021, third fragrance is currently being rolled out
  - New licence: As recently announced, Lalique Group will exclusively create and distribute a collection of perfumes for Superdry, a global and multichannel British fashion brand
  - Strong whisky sales contributed to more than trebled revenues in The Glenturret segment

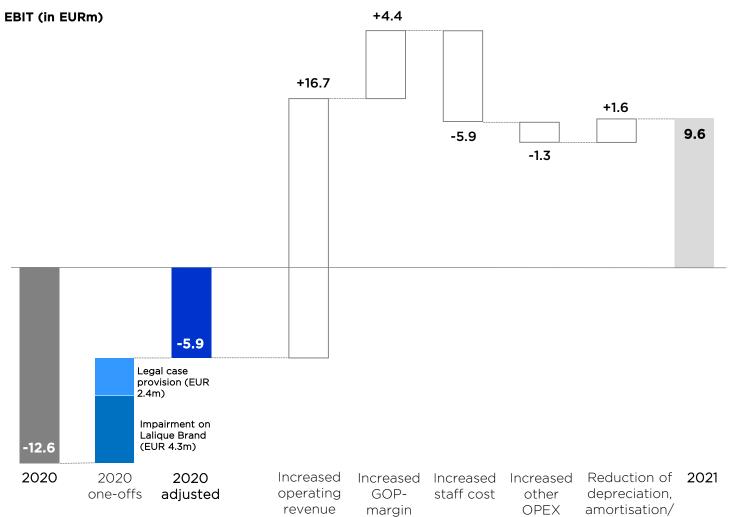
- Operating revenue up 28% after the Group's business was severely impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020
- Cost side reflects continued disciplined cost management as well as return to higher business volumes
- EBIT of EUR 9.6m vs. EUR -5.9m (excluding one-off litigation provision of EUR 2.4m and brand impairment charge of EUR 4.3m in 2020)
- Including Covid-19 related government grants of EUR 1.4m (vs. EUR 0.6m in 2020)
- Including furlough grants of EUR 1.2m (vs. EUR 2.9m in 2020)

# 2021 EBIT improved by EUR 15.5m (excluding one-LALIOUE off effects in 2020)



Increase in EBIT 2021 driven by:

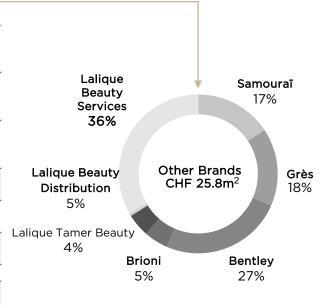
- Growth of operating revenues reflecting sales recovery in all markets
- Improved gross profit margin of 56.5% (vs. 53.4% in 2020)
- Increased staff costs in the context of a return to higher business volumes
- Lower other operating costs thanks to continued disciplined cost management in marketing (incl. trade shows) as well as reduced business travels

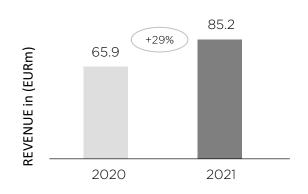


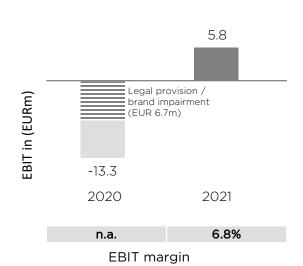

# Lalique segment: noticeably improved operational profitability in rebounding markets



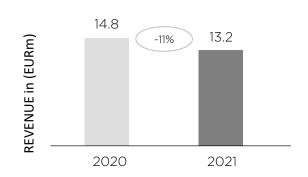


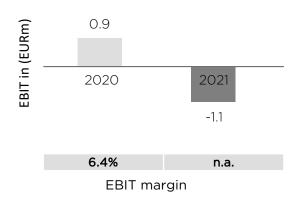


- Sales rebounded by 29% vs. 2020 and were up 5% vs. the 2019 prepandemic level, primarily reflecting strong perfumes sales
- In Lalique Parfums (up 70%), growth was particularly driven by establishment of own distribution in Middle East and strong demand in China
- In Crystal (up 14%), sales recovered but remained below pre-pandemic level, as some markets were still impacted by Covid-19 in the first half of the year
- Gastronomy/hospitality establishments resumed business after lockdowns; newly acquired Château Lafaurie-Peyraguey H&R contributed with additional revenues
- Costs remained stable (up 2%), excluding the provision for litigation in France (EUR 2.4m) and the non-cash impairment on the brand value of Lalique (EUR 4.3m) recognized in 2020, despite the acquisition of Château Lafaurie-Peyraguey H&R in July 2021
- EBIT increased to EUR 5.8m, thanks to improved operating results across all business areas

## Ultrasun: impacted by travel restrictions and lower demand in Far East



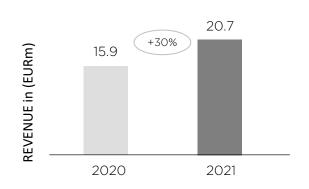




- Operating revenue down 11% due to continued restrictions on holiday travel and lower demand in Far Eastern markets
- Performance in selected key markets:
  - CH: flat vs. prior year
  - UK: sales growth despite lockdown at beginning of the year
  - DE: increased revenues due to set-up of own sales team
- Operating costs remained on prior-year level
- EBIT declined to EUR -1.1m as a function of lower top-line volume and decrease in gross margin due to the liquidation as well as scraping of discontinued product lines

# Jaguar: strong profitability based on solid sales growth and stable operating costs



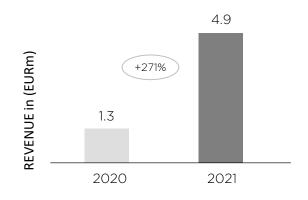


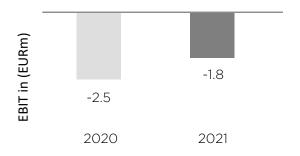
- Operating revenues up 30%, driven particularly by key markets Germany and Poland, as well as the Middle East, Italy and Chile, albeit still below pre-pandemic levels
- Based on solid sales growth and stable operating costs, EBIT improved to EUR 3.5m
- EBIT margin increased to 17%, higher than pre-pandemic level (2019: 16%)







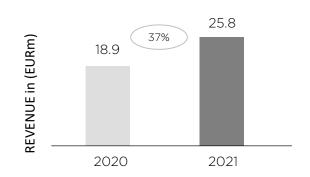


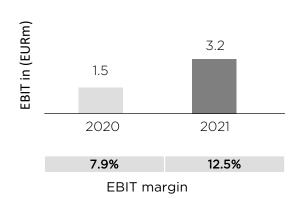


- Whisky sales noticeably increased in 2021
- Visitor centre was affected by poor international travel to Scotland, but refurbished Café and new Lalique Restaurant contributed positively
- Operating expenses increased in connection with launch of Lalique restaurant
- EBIT reached EUR -1.8m, break-even expected in 2022

## Other brands: doubled profitability with sales growth, Brioni brand and own distribution in ME







- Bentley Fragrances reported exceptionally strong performance (up 87%) in 2021 driven by the US, the online channel in Europe and solid contribution from the Middle East
- Parfum Grès grew 3.1% as markets in Southern Europe and Latin America were still strongly affected by the pandemic
- Parfums Samouraï remained on prior-year level as state of emergency remained in place in Japan for most of the year
- Perfume filling facility Lalique Beauty Services increased operating revenues thanks to higher filling and handling volumes for Lalique Beauty and growing business with third-party customers
- New Brioni license brand and new set-up with own distribution in Middle East also contributed to growth in sales and operating profit
- EBIT improved noticeably to EUR 3.2m at EBIT margin of 13%

- Net cash position down by EUR 1.0m to EUR 21.4m due to reduction of cash and cash equivalents and bank overdrafts
- Covid credits due for repayment were reclassified from non-current financial liabilities in other current liabilities
- Net debt decreased from EUR 44.9m to EUR 41.0m
- Net debt / EBITDA ratio significantly improved from 5.9 to 1.7
- Strong equity ratio further improved to 50.9% (2020: 46.2%)

## Business Priorities and Outlook



## Business priorities for 2022



- Recovery experienced in 2021 is expected to continue in 2022, although global economic environment is characterized by uncertainties, especially in view of current geopolitical tensions due to the Russian invasion of Ukraine and related economic sanctions
- Perfumes: continued focus on selected product launches and projects:
  - Roll-out of third Brioni fragrance started in April 2022
  - Expansion of brand portfolio with new brand Superdry (as recently announced); the Group will create and distribute a collection of women's and men's perfumes for Superdry, a global and multi-channel British fashion brand

#### • Ultrasun:

- Development and launch of improved formulas for Far Eastern markets among others
- Rebound in sales revenue forecasted following ease of Covid-related travel restrictions

### Lalique:

- Continued development of Lalique brand through four exclusive establishments in the gastronomy and hospitality business
- Roll-out of AW crystal collection and launch of new art project to contribute to sales growth

#### The Glenturret:

Focus on further growth in whisky sales and increase in production capacity

### Financial outlook



Both our short-term as well as mid-term outlook are subject to unforeseeable events such as a significant worsening of the global economic environment, e.g. in relation to the Russian/Ukraine war or due to a renewed aggravation of the Covid-19 pandemic

### FY 2022:

- Lalique Group forecasts high single digit sales growth vs. 2021

### Mid-term targets, as set in April 2019:

- Lalique Group expects to achieve annual mid-single-digit growth in local currencies
- Lalique Group continues to expect that the Covid-19 pandemic has led to a delay of around 2 years towards the achievement of a gradual increase in EBIT margin to 9-11%

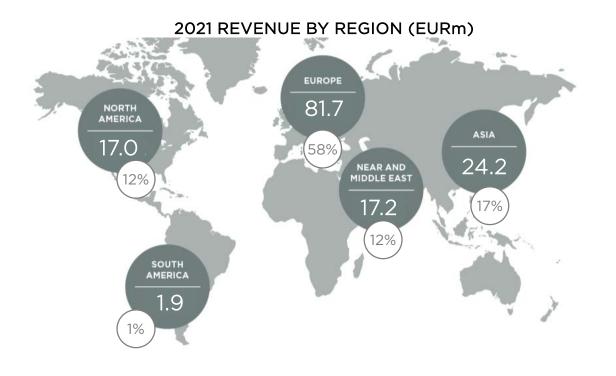

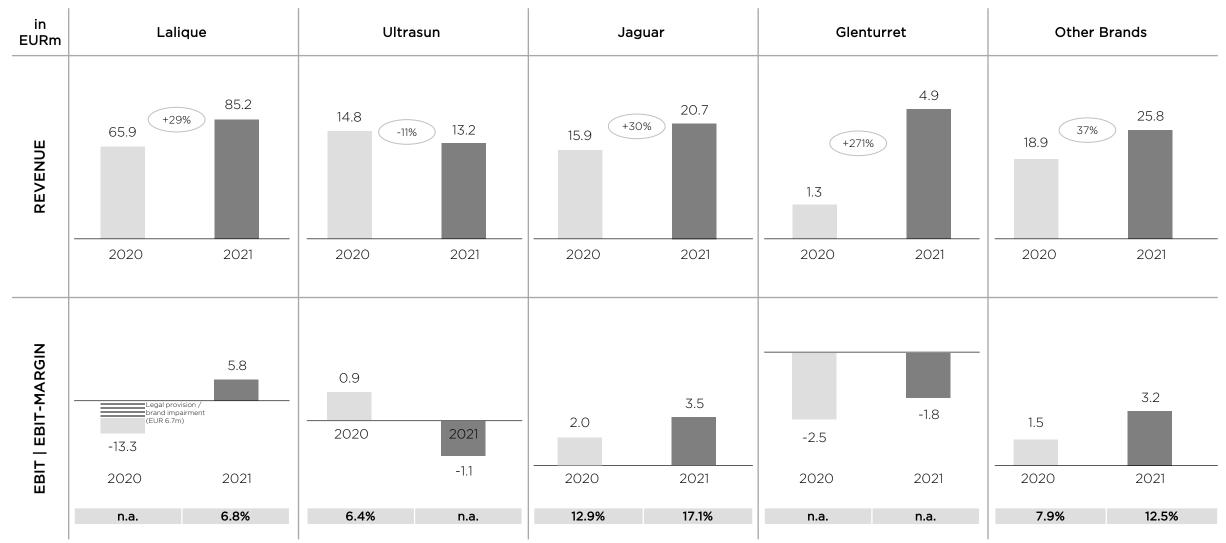

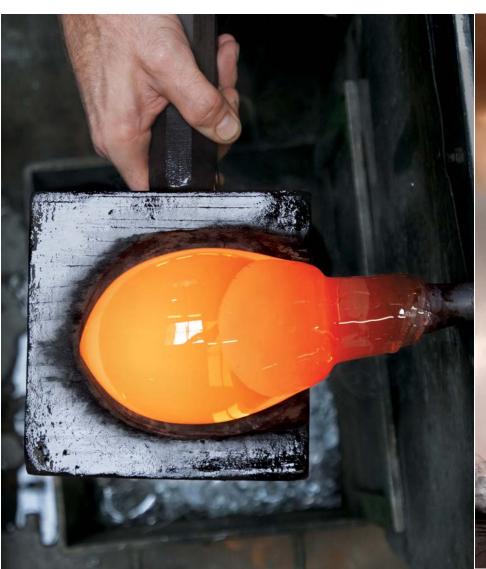
