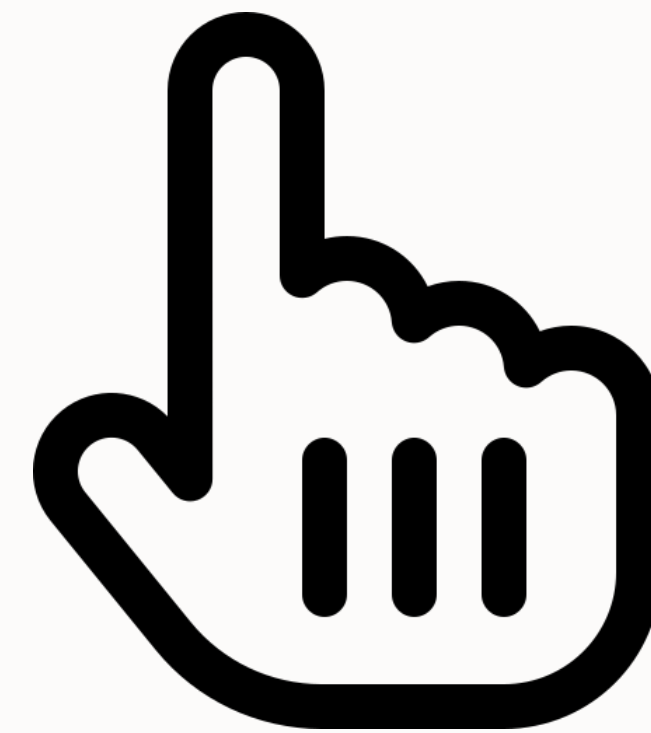



The Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) are the single source of truth for web accessibility. Level AA is the destination to aim for.
