

## Sixth Form Dress

It is a Sixth Form privilege not to wear school uniform as we want to support your individual and creative expression as young adults and the senior students in the school. The school expects that you will dress suitably for a working environment and follow the dress code below.

### Dress Code:

- Tops must cover the midriff, i.e. no crop tops
- Vest tops with thin straps are allowed but no completely strapless tops
- Underwear should not be visible, which would include avoiding tops made of see through material
- Please use your judgement on wearing low tops as to what is appropriate for a working environment
- No visible tattoos
- No visible piercings except for ear and nose piercings
- As a guide, skirts must be no shorter than halfway down the thigh; please use your judgement on this as to what is an appropriate length for a working environment
- No torn jeans or tops
- Leggings must not be see through
- Shorts are acceptable, but not cycling-style shorts
- No offensive slogans
- No hats or sunglasses to be worn indoors
- Scarves are allowed indoors, but not gloves
- Sandals are ok, but not flip-flops
- Makeup, hair styles and hair colours are down to the individual student

For school occasions where you are on duty or representing the school, more formal attire will be required.

### Sixth Form PE Kit:

Students must wear The Tiffin Girls' School branded PE t-shirt and black shorts/skort/leggings for PE lessons and extra curricular clubs/fixtures:

- The Tiffin Girls' School branded t-shirt – must be purchased from Stevensons: <https://www.stevensons.co.uk/Schools/the-tiffin-girls-school-kingston-upon-thames/805>
- Leggings – these must be black, and can be purchased from a sports shop (Nike, Adidas) or Stevensons. They should be of appropriate material for sport; cotton leggings are not allowed.
- Shorts/Skort – these must be black and of an appropriate length, and can be purchased from a sports shop or Stevensons.
- Trainers – these can be any colour but must be sports-specific trainers; fashion trainers are not allowed (e.g. Nike internationalists, Vans, Converse, Air Max, Veja etc)

**Jewellery rules for Sixth Form PE lessons:**

- Under the AfPE guidelines for health and safety, students are not allowed to wear jewellery of any kind whilst playing sports.
- All earrings/piercings must be removed for PE lessons/clubs/fixtures; you are not allowed to cover up any piercings with tape. If students would like to get their ears pierced, please wait until the first week of the summer holidays to allow healing time so that earrings can be removed by the time of the first PE lesson in September.
- Religious bands can be worn, but must be covered up with a sweatband.
