How much opposition and resistance was there in wartime?	 Rationing; propaganda and morale; impact of the war on the Volksgemeinschaft; the mobilisation of the economy for war and the work of Speer; the use of foreign labour; the origins of the Final Solution; the Wannsee Conference; responsibility for the Holocaust; opposition and resistance from different groups. 	 Students will analyse the impact of rationing, indoctrination, propaganda and morale on the German population. Students will be able to analyse changes in the wartime economy and the work of Speer. Pupils will assess changes in policies towards Jews and consider the influence of the war on these. Students will evaluate the extent of opposition and resistance to the regime throughout the war.
