



SPRING GIVING REPORT 2026

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School updates

The majority of this year's fundraising has been in order to replace the school's boiler and heating distribution system. In November, we were able to secure a significant capital grant from the Department of Education to fund 75% of the project. In order to fund the remaining 25%, Tiffin Girls' launched a fundraising appeal on the School Birthday in February, our School Birthday Giving Appeal. So far, with Gift Aid alongside parent and alumnae donations, we have raised £35,000 and we are extremely grateful for this strong start. However, to reach our initial target of £50,000 we are aiming to raise a further £10,000. Project Progress

- Asbestos survey in the boiler house completed (removal scheduled for Easter)
- Old boilers have been removed
- Temporary boiler due for removal in April
- New boilers delivered
- Installation of the boilers and system connections to the Art and DT block and Science block need to be made
- We are working towards having the full system operational by the Winter term.



School updates

STGSC Donations:

Parent donations to STGSC (Support Tiffin Girls' School Charity) make a huge difference to the teaching and learning educational facilities at Tiffin Girls. They supplement the learning resources for all subject areas and support the health and welfare of the students. They also provide support for larger capital bids, for example the sports hall and funding the boiler project.

This year, thanks to parent donations, STGSC are giving £50,000 to the school to go towards educational resources.

Purchases that will be made with this money include:

- 3D printer and specialist equipment for DT
- Art materials
- PE equipment including springboards and table tennis tables
- Visualisers for teaching, allowing teachers to display real-time, live images of documents or 3D objects for the entire class
- Curriculum texts, including 190 copies of Northanger Abbey
- Specialist robotic equipment for the Computer Science department

Student-led fundraising
